



DATE:March 8, 2021RE:Statement – Covid-19 VaccinesFROM:Sean P. Dolan

On March 3, 2021, the Diocese of Rockville Centre issued a memo to clergy and the faithful in response to concerns of the faithful that was intended to provide clarification on the hierarchical preference of available vaccines based only on their connection to the gravely evil act of abortion. That statement is consistent with statements from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the entity that represents the U.S. Bishops. According to the USCCB statement, "if one has the ability to choose a vaccine, Pfizer or Moderna's vaccines should be chosen over Johnson & Johnson's" (USCCB – March 2, 2021 statement -<u>https://www.usccb.org/news/2021/us-bishop-chairmen-doctrine-and-pro-life-address-use-johnsonjohnson-covid-19-vaccine</u>). While we should continue to insist that pharmaceutical companies stop using abortion-derived cell lines, given the world-wide suffering that this pandemic is causing, we affirm again that being vaccinated can be an act of charity that serves the common good. Therefore, if alternative vaccines are not reasonably available, individuals may choose to receive the Johnson and Johnson's vaccine.

Vaccine safety, efficacy, medical circumstances, etc. were not the focus, nor did this memo claim to provide guidance on the decision to vaccinate. Consent to vaccination is a prudential judgment that should be based on a well-formed conscience of which this memo provided one aspect for discernment. **Such a decision also must be made in consultation with one's own physician.** The memo clearly states this is not a comprehensive evaluation of the vaccines and, to this end, other resources were provided for further information. It is the position of the Catholic Church and the responsibility of all Bishops to instruct the faithful in the truth that abortion is a violation of natural law. It is a gravely evil act because it is the deliberate killing of an innocent human being. The Church teaches that corpses of all human embryos and fetuses, directly aborted or not, must be treated with the same dignity and respect as all other human remains. In this, it also teaches that the sacrifice of human life for therapeutic purposes is wholly immoral and incompatible with human dignity because it is the exploitation of one human being in the involuntary service of another. Therefore, abortion is a morally evil act which cannot be voided or reduced in gravity even by the good intention to help others (i. e. as vaccine production).

ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to observe the laws of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.



Did You Know?

Gifts of appreciated securities are generally more cost effective than gifts of cash. A gift of stock with a long-term gain entitles a donor to a charitable deduction for the full current market value and is exempt from any capital gains tax. For example, if you acquired stock for \$1,000 and the current market value is \$5,000, you can deduct the full \$5,000 and escape tax on the \$4,000 capital gain. Under IRS rules, the value of the gift is the mean of the high and the low price on the day the stock passes from the donor's control.

If you wish to make a gift of securities held by bank or brokerage, electronic transfer is the easiest method. Do not sell the stock in your name and have the proceeds sent to us, as this will constitute a cash contribution, and you will be liable for any capital gains tax.

Principal's Announcements

In this week's Gospel, the Pharisee Nicodemus has come to Jesus at nighttime to ask him questions about who

he is and where he comes from. Jesus here explains that the ancient bronze serpent Moses made served as a foreshadowing of his role as Savior. While the ancient Israelites had to look at



the bronze serpent on a pole to be healed from snake-bites, Jesus will be "lifted up" on a cross. To be saved from the "snake-bite" of sin, we must look to him, raised up on the Cross. Then Jesus hands us the heart of the Gospel message—that God loved us and sent his Son that we might come to believe in him and so gain eternal life. God does not want to condemn us but heal us and rescue us from sin. Yet, unfortunately, many of us will run from the light rather than turn toward the light. Jesus predicts that many will prefer the darkness and deliberately avoid believing in Jesus so that they do not have to change their behavior: "Their deeds were evil" (John 3:19).

Our behavior and our belief go hand-in-hand, just like Paul shows in the reading from Ephesians. If we do evil deeds, we will want to hide them in the darkness, but if we do "what is true" then we will come to the Light himself and be saved by him. Those who believe look to the Lord shun the darkness and live their lives in the light.



Mass Reminders

Thank you for helping us keep the Cathedral and Parish Center safe for worship during these challenging times. Let us continue to be as vigilant as possible for the safety of others as we gather together to give Glory and Praise to God.

Please be reminded that all COVID protocols remain in effect.



For the protection of all in attendance we remind you that it is required that all persons in the Cathedral and Parish Center over the age of 2 wear a mask that covers <u>both their mouth and</u> their nose.

We likewise ask that no one remove the ropes in the Cathedral, so we can maintain proper social distancing. It is also important that we keep a distance of 6 feet from others while inside, in particular during the reception of Holy Communion.

Because of concerns regarding the coronavirus, we request that those who choose to receive on the tongue please present themselves to the priest only to receive Holy Communion, and are asked to open their mouth



and extend their tongue so the host can be placed on it without the priest's hand making contact with the recipient. If you choose to receive in the hand, please place your hand out very straight and flat to allow the priest or minister to place the Eucharist safely in order to avoid contact with your hand. We also kindly remind everyone to please remove your mask before receiving Holy Communion, whether you choose to receive on the tongue or in the hand. Please put it back on after you have consumed the host.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre leaves the choice to receive in the hand or on the tongue at the discretion of each communicant.

Dispensation from Mass

As a reminder, the dispensation from the requirement to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect. Those who are most vulnerable and at a greater risk (due to age, preexisting health conditions or being in close proximity to vulnerable people) are encouraged to remain home at this time. *If a person shows any symptoms of illness, they are asked to please not come to church.* We encourage you to join us for Mass on the Catholic Faith Network or via our Facebook and YouTube livestream.
