



Divine Mercy Sunday4.11.213:00 p.m.

In the 1930's Our Lord appeared to a Polish nun named Sister Maria Faustina. He asked for a feast to be celebrated the Sunday after Easter. That feast is now known as Divine Mercy Sunday, which was instituted by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina in April, 2000.

Our Lord instructed an image be painted according to the pattern that Sr. Faustina had seen, along with the request to have this image venerated throughout the world. The Lord also requested that the Chaplet be said not only by Sr. Faustina, but by others: "Encourage souls to say the Chaplet that I have given you."

Principal's Announcements



Divine Mercy Sunday was officially instituted in 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II. In the 1930's, Jesus appeared to a young Polish nun (now St. Faustina) and entrusted the message of Divine Mercy to her in a particular way for our time. Our world is full

of so much evil, and Our Lord wants to remind us of his Divine Mercy and the need for repentance. This Sunday is also the last day of the Octave of Easter, and so, in a sense, it is the climax of our celebration of Easter. As we reach the height of our Easter octave, the readings focus on God's mercy. Why is that? God's merciful love is the Good News of the Gospel, and the reason why Christ suffered, died, and rose again. The Catechism goes so far as to say that, "The Gospel is the revelation in Jesus Christ of God's mercy to sinners." God's mercy reached down to us in our sinful state and sent us a Savior, who took on human flesh so that we might have life with him.

In this week's Gospel reading, Jesus institutes the Sacrament of Reconciliation, giving the Apostles a share in his authority by granting them the power to forgive sins. Instead of rebuking the Apostles for abandoning him in his time of suffering, Jesus breathes the gift of the Holy Spirit upon them and confers on them his own mission to seek out and save



the lost. Through this beautiful gift of mercy, Jesus demonstrates his desire to forgive our sins and restore us to full communion with him when we do fall into sin. This assurance should bring us peace and joy. Sometimes it can be difficult to believe in the forgiveness of sins, and St. Thomas reminds us how difficult it can be to believe in Christ even by one who had walked with him. But, like Thomas, Jesus invites us to touch his wounds and be healed of our doubts. St. Peter tells us that "by his wounds, you have been healed." Through the healing power of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we too can touch Christ's wounds and proclaim with Thomas, "My Lord and my God!" According to Jesus's words, our belief in the teachings handed down by the successors of the Apostles is merited as great faith: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." This faith, John writes, allows us to "have life in his name."

Welcome back! I hope everyone had a nice Easter and a relaxing vacation. We are now in the homestretch of the school year. Please take note of this week's events.

Did You Know? Gifts of appreciated securities are generally more cost effective than gifts of cash. A gift of stock with a long-term gain entitles a donor to a charitable deduction for the full current market value and is exempt from any capital gains tax. For example, if you acquired stock for \$1,000 and the current market value is \$5,000, you can deduct the full \$5,000 and escape tax on the \$4,000 capital gain. Under IRS rules, the value of the gift is the mean of the high and the low price on the day the stock passes from the donor's control. If you wish to make a gift of securities held by bank or brokerage, electronic transfer is the easiest method. Do not sell the stock in your name and have the proceeds sent to us, as this will constitute a cash contribution, and you will be liable for any capital gains tax. Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us every **Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:30—5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

Nocturnal Adoration is held in the Holy Cross Chapel on the First Friday night of each month from 8:00—10:00 p.m. **There will be no Nocturnal Adoration for the month of April.**

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Saturday in the Cathedral except on the First Saturday, when it is recited at 8:30 a.m.

Please remember to sit in every other pew and maintain social distancing. All visitors must wear a mask inside the Cathedral and Chapel.

Dispensation from Mass

As a reminder, the dispensation from the requirement to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect. Mass Reminders

Thank you for helping us keep the Cathedral and Parish Center safe for worship during these challenging times. Let us continue to be as vigilant as possible for the safety of others as we gather together to give Glory and Praise to God.

Please be reminded that all COVID protocols remain in effect.



For the protection of all in attendance we remind you that it is required that all persons in the Cathedral and Parish Center over the age of 2 wear a mask that covers <u>both their mouth and</u> <u>their nose</u>.


We likewise ask that no one remove the ropes in the Cathedral, so we can maintain proper social distancing. It is also important that we keep a distance of 6 feet from others while inside, in particular during the reception of Holy Communion.

Because of concerns regarding the coronavirus, we request that those who choose to receive on the tongue please present themselves to the priest only to receive Holy Communion, and



are asked to open their mouth and extend their tongue so the host can be placed on it without the priest's hand making contact with the recipient. If you choose to receive in the hand, please place your hand out very straight and flat to allow the priest or minister to place the Eucharist safely in order to avoid contact with your hand. We also kindly remind everyone to please remove your mask before receiving Holy Communion, whether you choose to receive on the tongue or in the hand. Please put it back on after you have consumed the host.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre leaves the choice to receive in the hand or on the tongue at the discretion of each communicant.


