

Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

Nocturnal Adoration is held in the Holy Cross Chapel on the First Friday night of each month from 8:00–10:00 p.m.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Memorial Vestment Opportunity

The Cathedral of St. Agnes has purchased two Chasubles to be used for funeral Masses by the Principal Celebrant and Concelebrants of funeral Masses. These vestments are available for memorializing a loved one. Principal's Announcements

2nd Sunday of Lent: The Transfiguration



Consider today's Gospel reading from the perspective of the apostles Peter, James, and John. What an amazing experience it must have been for them to witness the Transfiguration!

Jesus singles these men out to join him as he ascends a mountain to pray. When they reach the summit, they see their master like never before. Jesus' face changes and his clothes become dazzling white, as Peter, James, and John catch a glimpse of his glory.

They also see Jesus conversing with two of the most famous men in Israel's history: Moses and Elijah. These men represent the two key parts of the Old Testament: Moses, as the author of the Torah, represents the Law; and Elijah, a great prophet, represents the Prophets. Together, their presence at this moment of Jesus' transfiguration symbolizes how the entire Old Testament—the Law and the prophets—finds fulfillment in Christ.

Finally, Peter, James, and John hear a heavenly voice—the voice of God the Father—say to them: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." This mysterious event continues to have spiritual application to our lives today. Like the three apostles, we are called to ascend with Jesus every time we pray. And in prayer with our Lord, we are called to seek his glorious face and listen to him.

Transportation requests for the 2022-23 school year are due to your home school district by March 31st. Please contact your home school district to make your request.




