





Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

Nocturnal Adoration is held in the Holy Cross Chapel on the First Friday night of each month from 8:00–10:00 p.m.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Long journeys are not always easy, and in today's Gospel reading, we find Jesus embarking on what is the most difficult journey of his life. From here in Luke chapter 9 until Jesus arrives in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday—ten chapters later—Jesus and his disciples will be on the road. And the journey ends in the place where Jesus will be crucified. The ultimate destination for his journey is the cross.

This week's readings remind us that we all face great challenges in the journey of life. And sometimes we can feel worried, discouraged, or very alone in the midst of those difficulties. The readings invite us to ask if we've ever felt like Elijah in today's first reading, who thought he was alone in his faith convictions, or like Jesus himself, who traveled to Jerusalem knowing the hostility, rejection, and suffering he would soon face.

We all know that life can be hard. The Christian life is not about escaping this. It's about facing the difficulties of life head-on, about knowing that suffering does not have the final say because Jesus has conquered suffering and death on the cross. If we have the courage to follow him and face life's challenges knowing that Jesus has gone before us, those sufferings can take on new meaning! That's what the Christian life is all about, and that's what our readings this week illuminate

More About Religious Freedom Week - June 22-29, 2022

Each year, the U.S. Catholic Bishops launch Religious Freedom Week on June 22, the feast day of SS Thomas More and Bishop John Fisher because these men, who gave their lives for the freedom of religion and freedom of conscience, are role-models for us to follow.

It's good to love one's country, but ultimate loyalty is due only to Christ and his Kingdom. These men loved their country but when the law of King Henry VIII came into conflict with the law of Christ, they submitted to Christ. They bear witness to the truth that no government can make a claim on a person's soul by compelling him to compromise his conscience.

More About the Eucharistic Revival - Begun on June 19, 2022

The Bishops of the U.S. are calling for a 3-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics healed, converted, formed and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist and sent out in mission "for the life of the world." (1)

"My hope is that truly a fire of love for Our Lord and the Eucharist will be ignited in our country and people will come to discover that Jesus has always been with us," said Franciscan Sister Alicia Torres.
