




In today's Gospel, Jesus stresses the importance of staying on the narrow path. Sin is never worth it.

You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

**Nocturnal Adoration** is held in the Holy Cross Chapel on the First Friday night of each month from 8:00–10:00 p.m.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.



### Religious Exemptions Denied in Proposed Changes to Dept. of Education Regulations

A rewriting of the Title IX Dept. of Education rules puts at risk the safety, privacy, and equality of girls and woman at schools that are federally funded. This recently proposed regulation "removes protections for religious institutions that adhere to a traditional belief on sexuality, gender, and marriage by eliminating previous protections that were reaffirmed in 2020." (1)

In 2010, when that administration expanded the definition of "sexual discrimination" in Title IX regulations to include alternative sexual identities, many religious schools sought assurances they wouldn't be forced - in violation of their sincerely held religious tenets and teachings - to open single-sex dorms to members of the opposite sex, to open bathrooms and locker rooms to individuals whose subjective self-gender identity runs counter to their biology, or to hire openly married same-sex couples. The long-standing religious exemption, guaranteed in 2010, was reaffirmed in the 2020 Title IX regulation. "Yet even though Title IX's religious exemption is firmly grounded in statutes, regulations, and judicial decisions, the recent 2022 draft Title IX regulation removes the religious protections without providing any justification for the proposed change. # Principal's Announcements

### The 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."

Have you ever missed an airplane flight? If you have, you know the sinking feeling as you approach the gate, see the closed door, and realize that you are now in a world of trouble. Today's Gospel reading takes that one step further and asks us to contemplate what it would be like to miss out on heaven, having that door shut on us forever. "There will be wailing and grinding of teeth," Jesus says, and he tells us that the wailing will last for eternity. When the people of Jesus' time heard this, they wanted to know how many people were going to be saved. Today we might ask the same question; we want to know if we are going to be among those on the inside or those left on the outside. Jesus doesn't respond with a number or a percentage. Instead, he tells us to "strive to enter through the narrow gate." And then he ominously adds that "many...will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." So what are we to do if we don't want to have the door to eternity shut on us, to have the master say he never knew us? The answer is as simple as it is challenging. Following the example of Jesus, we need to sacrifice our own wants and desires in order to live our lives for God and for others. Each time we stretch ourselves to love others we build up the strength and virtue needed to pass through the narrow way. Jesus warns us that it will not be easy, but he also encourages us that it is not impossible, for it is love that enables us to find our way and Jesus himself, who has promised never to leave us.

This year's school theme is "We are Workers in God's Vineyard." We are not workers because we wished to be workers; it is God who called us to be. It is our mission to strive to know God better by carrying out His will. Working in the vineyard is not easy. Those who don't successfully work in the vineyard will have a very challenging time entering heaven. "Many...will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." This year we are going to focus on being strong workers in God's vineyard. We are going to strengthen ourselves physically through good actions and deeds and spiritually through our prayer life. We will build up the virtues needed to pass through the narrow gate.

All students in Grades 1-8 should be in either the summer or the formal uniform. The summer uniform will be in effect from September 7th to October 15th for those who choose to wear it.

Girls' skirts may not be more than 2 inches above the knee.

Boys' hair must be short, neat and well-groomed.

Students out of compliance with the uniform code will not be permitted to attend class.

New Students should report to the Main Office. They will be escorted to the Library for an orientation.

Kindergarten will begin on Thursday, September 8th for students with last names A-L and Friday, September 9th for last names M-Z. These opening days for Kindergarten are full days. Kindergarten students must bring a lunch and a snack to school every day.

The children should assemble in the school yard behind the school no later than 8:30 A.M. on this day only. Kindergarten parents should be present on the first day. In the event of rain, we will assemble in the Carlin Dining Hall. Kindergarten will dismiss at 2:45 P.M. for car riders and bus riders.

Students with last names A-L do not report to school on Friday and Kindergarten students with last names M-Z do not report to school on Thursday.

On Monday, September 12th and thereafter, All Kindergarten students should enter the school via the Carlin Doors on Clinton if they are a bus student or the Kindergarten Doors off the playground if they are using the Morning Drop-off. The Kindergarten Aides, Special Content Teachers, and Mrs. Brower will be on Clinton Ave. for the bus students, I will be in the back to assist the Morning Drop-off with additional teachers.
