# PERSISTENCE IN PRAYER

In today's Gospel reading we encounter a passage commonly known as "the parable of the unjust judge." This isn't a parable about justice or judges. Rather it is another teaching about persistence and prayer. In this story, a widow keeps coming back to a judge. Finally, because of her persistence, the judge grants her justice.

Jesus isn't telling us that we must nag God before he will answer. Rather, he is saying that we must be willing to keep asking, even when it seems like the answer is delayed. He is giving us a lesson in the importance of persistence. True, heartfelt prayer isn't easy...We are created for prayer—communication with God—but because of our fallen human nature, we would often rather do other, easier things.

The Gospel passage tells us that we need to be both persistent and consistent in our prayer—not because God won't hear us unless we are, but because through our persistence and consistency we are better able to be faithful to the promptings of the Spirit and enter into communion with the one who loves us.

# Focus on Religious Freedom

#### Legalized Religious Persecution Comes to America

On Sept. 23, 2022, Catholic pro-life activist, Mark Houck, was arrested by a fully armed team of FBI agents at his home in PA in front of his wife and seven young children after the agents had pounded on the door in the early morning. "They said they were going to break in if he didn't open it. And then they had about 5 guns pointed at my husband, myself, and basically at my kids," said Mrs. Houck. (1)

Houck is accused of assaulting a male Planned Parenthood client escort outside a Philadelphia abortion clinic on Oct. 23, 2021, under the *Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act.* Houck regularly prays the Rosary, hands out literature, and does some "sidewalk counseling" outside the clinic. On this day, when "the escort began harassing Mark's 12-year-old son, they walked down the street away from the building entrance. The escort followed them and when he continued yelling at the boy, getting within his personal space, Mark pushed him away," wrote a spokesperson.

(2) The man fell down but was not seriously hurt, requiring only "a Band-Aid on his finger," said the spokesperson.

(3) After local authorities declined to press charges, the escort pressed charges in Philadelphia municipal court, but the case was dismissed when the man repeatedly failed to show up for court dates.

If convicted, Houck could face 11 years in prison. "This case is being brought solely to intimidate people of faith and pro-life Americans," said Peter Breen, Thomas More Society senior counselor. "Mark Houck is innocent of these lawless charges and we intend to prove that in court." (4)

In the meantime, "Nobody responsible for the nearly 100 attacks, including firebombs and vandalism, on pro-life pregnancy centers has been charged by the Department of Justice (DOJ), wrote Greg Price of xStrategies. <sup>(5)</sup> These frequent attacks, many by pro-abortion group "Jane's Revenge", were seemingly ignored after the Supreme Court decision in June on Roe v Wade.

"This kind of overreaction for a minor infraction of the law is deeply troubling and it becomes even more troubling when paired with the under reaction by the DOJ when the pro-life side is targeted," wrote William Donohue, Catholic League president. <sup>(6)</sup>

#### Berkeley develops "Jewish-free Zones"

Nine student groups at U.C. Berkeley created "Jewish-free Zones" when they adopted a rule forbidding pro-Israel speakers at school events. The controversial bylaw, promulgated by a pro-Palestinian group on campus, says it aims to stop the spread of Zionist (pro-Israel) beliefs.

"It is troubling to broadly exclude a particular viewpoint from being expressed," said Dean Erwin Chemerinsky, who is Jewish. "This would mean that I could not be invited to speak because I support the existence of Israel, though I condemn many of their policies." (7)



# With Organ and Voice Music at Saint Agnes Cathedral

# Sunday, October 23, 7:30 PM Guest Organ Recitalist: Ann Labounsky, from Duquesne University

Ann Labounsky has earned an enviable international reputation as a virtuoso performer and improvisor at the organ, and particularly, as a leading American disciple of Jean Langlais. From 1962 to 1964 Ann Labounsky lived and studied in Paris as a recipient of a Fulbright Grant. As an organ student of André Marchal and Jean Langlais, she immersed herself in the French organ tradition; she studied most of Langlais's compositions with the composer, and played them for him on the organ at Sainte-Clotilde.



She was awarded the diploma with the highest honors at the organ competition at the Soissons Cathedral. She has performed world premieres of many of Langlais's compositions and works by American composers. In addition to extensive performances in the United States, Dr. Labounsky has made concert tours of Europe, performing at Sainte-Clotilde in Paris on each tour, as well as in Brittany, the Netherlands, Germany, the Ukraine, and Scotland.

Dr. Labounsky is the author of a biography of Langlais, Jean Langlais: the Man and His Music, published in 2000 by Amadeus Press, Portland, Oregon. She completed recording the complete organ works by Jean Langlais for the Musical Heritage Society which were recently released through Voix du Vent Recordings including 26 CDs and a 152-page book of liner notes. As Director of Organ and Sacred Music at Duquesne University, she oversees undergraduate and graduate programs in sacred music. An active member of the American Guild of Organists, Church Music Association of America, and the National Pastoral Musicians, she holds the Fellow and Choir Master certificates from the AGO and served as Director of the National Committee on Improvisation, Councilor for Education for the American Guild of Organists, and National Director of Certification for the National Pastoral Musicians. She currently serves as Organist and Choir Director at the Church of the Redeemer in Squirrel Hill, Pittsburgh.


