In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus says that God is "not God of the dead, but of the living" (Luke 20:38). You might think that's a pretty obvious statement. But it has profound implications for how we live as Christians because this reality underlies something at the heart of Catholic teaching—the Communion of the Saints.

The saints, those who have died and gone before us in faith, remain connected to us through Jesus Christ. They aren't detached spirits floating about in some mystical realm but fellow members of Christ's body who remain deeply concerned about God's plan for salvation here on earth. They have been through the same struggles we have, and they now stand before God's throne in heaven, cheering us on as we live out our lives and missions here on earth.

They are alive in the body of Christ, just as we are. Because they are alive in Christ, we can ask them to pray for us and intercede for us. This is our basic understanding of the Communion of Saints—through Jesus, we are all "in communion" with each other. We can ask the saints, as our brothers and sisters in heaven, to lift us up to our God and intercede on our behalf. The readings for this week reaffirm that belief by reminding us that God is indeed the God of the living those of us still on earth as well as those who now live directly in the Divine Presence.

Focus on Religious Freedom

Some Good News for Religious Freedom

A California judge has ruled in favor of a Christian cake designer in the latest court decision regarding the conflict between religious freedom and same-sex marriage.⁽¹⁾ This is the latest in a series of court decisions over several years regarding wedding vendors such as cake designers, florists, photographers and artists who refuse to use their creative talents for same-sex ceremonies because of their biblically based belief that marriage is only between a man and a woman.

The evidence showed that the baker, Cathy Miller, both employs and serves LGBT people but that she has a long-standing policy for refusing to bake cakes that violate her Christian beliefs. ⁽²⁾ "The State asks this court to compel Miller to use her talents to design and create a cake she has not yet conceived with the knowledge that her work will be displayed in a celebration of a marital union her religion forbids," wrote the Superior Court Judge. "For this court to force such compliance would do violence to the essentials of Free Speech guaranteed under the First Amendment." ⁽³⁾

Some Bad News for Religious Freedom

A Colorado Christian baker, Jack Phillips, who won a partial victory of 7-2 at the US Supreme Court in 2018 when he declined to create a wedding cake for a same-sex couple, is now on trial for refusing to design a transgender birthday cake for a woman who requested a specialized cake in honor of her gender transition. Phillips' attorney from Alliance Defending Freedom explained that forcing him to create a message

Thanksgiving Food Drive

Phillips also objects to making cakes with other messages he opposes, including Halloween items. ⁽⁴⁾

"It's one thing to be sued repeatedly; it's another to watch your family suffer harassment and face death threats, be forced to lay off longtime employees, and lose a substantial part of your business," reads a statement from Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF). ⁽⁵⁾ "No American should be bullied or banished from the marketplace simply for living and working consistently with their faith," ADF stated. "Opponents of religious freedom want to strip away our freedom to live and work consistently with our deeply held beliefs.... Praise God that Jack refused to give up his freedom without a fight. He knows it's not just his own religious freedom on the line it's yours too." ⁽⁶⁾






