THE PAPAL BLESSING WITH PLENARY INDULGENCE

His Excellency the Most Reverend John O. Barres, by the privilege extended to him by the Holy See, will impart the Papal Blessing at the conclusion of the Chrism Mass to be celebrated Tuesday, April 4 at 4:00 P.M. to which is attached a plenary indulgence. In order to gain this indulgence, the faithful must be present for the blessing at the end of Mass, or be listening live via television, live-stream or radio, and fulfill the following conditions: be in the state of grace at the time of the blessing; 2. have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; have sacramentally confessed their sins; * receive the Holy Eucharist; * 5. pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff. † This requirement may be fulfilled within 20 days (before or after) receiving the blessing. † One Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice.

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.





Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem where He is proclaimed King, as many people of His time were seeking a political Messiah. We, like those who greeted Jesus, use palms to show our willingness to accept Jesus as our leader and to follow Him.

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, He was entering the holiest city of the Jewish religion, the city of the Great Temple, the center of which was the Holy of Holies, a place so revered that only the High Priest of the year was allowed to enter it. Yet, it was in Jerusalem that Jesus was betrayed, falsely accused, humiliated and handed over to an occupying force by the senior religious leaders, so He could be tortured and executed.

In the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, the Church gives us a dramatic, intense, and richly symbolic expression of the very heart of our faith. By participating in the liturgy of these three days, we can deepen our understanding of what it means for us to be Catholic.

Holy Week is a time to be reunited with Jesus as an understanding life companion. On the night before He died, Jesus did something rather extraordinary- He washed the feet of His apostles, in spite of their protests. He had a special purpose in doing this: "Do you understand what I have done? You call Me your teacher and Lord, and you should, because that is what I am. And if your Lord and teacher has washed your feet, you should do the same for each other. I have set the example, and you should do for each other exactly what I have done for you." John 13: 12-15.

The children have completed their Lenten Acts of Kindness, have prayed for you, the parishioners of St. Agnes Cathedral Parish, and given alms to the poor. They have grown in their faith and are well-prepared to enter Holy Week.


