The Way, The Truth, The Life

This week's Gospel points us toward the Ascension. Jesus tells the Apostles he is going to prepare a place for them "in my Father's house." We discover that Jesus is leaving to go to the Father, but he assures his disciples that this absence is only so that he may prepare a place for them. He promises, "I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." The last part of that phrase is a reflection of Jesus's Incarnation and mission. He comes to us to dwell with us in time, in the flesh, and in so doing, wins us the ability to dwell with him in eternity.

What makes this astounding thing possible is Jesus's unity with the Father in the Holy Trinity. So much of what Jesus promised requires his divinity. Unless he was God, he couldn't save us from sin, he couldn't gain us entry to Heaven, and he couldn't give us his flesh to eat. This is what Jesus reveals in the second part of this passage when he says, "I am in the Father and the Father is in me."

Catholic Veterans at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center No Longer Guaranteed Catholic Pastoral Care

Roughly 20% of our military personnel are Catholics. Thanks to an incomprehensible decision by the hospital, if they or their dependents end up at Walter Reed, they are no longer guaranteed ready access to the Church's sacraments. Just days before Holy Week, Walter Reed ended its contract for pastoral care with the Franciscan friars of Holy Name College in nearby Silver Spring, Maryland. Incredibly, they are being replaced by a secular government contractor that offers a wide range of specialists in "administrative and religious staffing." In other words, they are not necessarily priests, and therefore cannot administer the sacraments often asked for by Catholics in the hospital: celebration of the Holy Mass, confession anointing of the sick, and last rites.

Archbishop for the Military Services Timothy Broglio, elected president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops last year, is not happy, to put it mildly – and the hospital should be warned that he is a formidable defender of the Catholics in his care. He says it is "incomprehensible" that essential pastoral care is being taken away from the sick and the aged and that the new contracting group "cannot provide the necessary service." https://www.ncregister.com/commentaries/the-tone-deaf-development-at-walter-reed


