Principal's Announcements

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Do Not Be Afraid

Jesus was very clear about the cost of discipleship. It might entail family division, persecution, and even death. He didn't mince words when he talked about the hardships his followers would face. And yet, at the same time he says, "Do not be afraid." Isn't this a bit of a contradiction? Does it seem odd that Jesus warns us about future difficulties but then tells us not to worry?

However, the key to understanding this Sunday's Gospel reading lies in what Jesus means by "fear." First, Jesus is telling us that we should not fear our enemies in this world. We needn't have the kind of stomach churning, heart-pounding fear that comes from being terrified of the persecutions we may face. God the Father knows us even down to the hairs on our head, and he will be with us to help us face whatever sufferings we might encounter.

In today's Gospel, the Lord encourages us, instead of fearing persecution, to have instead a healthy fear of the Lord~ which is the fear or awe that a person might have in the presence of a good, noble, and magnificent king. That kind of fear empowers us to live out the Christian life in a heroic, unfearful manner. By trusting in such a good God who will be with us in whatever obstacles we might face, we are free to be bold in our witness to the Gospel. Now while it's true that some Christians may be asked to give up their lives as a result of following Jesus, for most of us our call to heroism will consist of the daily sacrifices that ordinary life calls for. The sacrifice of forgoing gossip, of enduring insults, of being misunderstood, of holding our tongues and our tempers. While today's Gospel might seem foreboding, we have nothing to fear. Even the worst thing that could happen -death-has been conquered by Christ's resurrection.

2023 - A year for Faith and A Year for Concern for Religious Liberty

"Eucharistic Revival: My Flesh for the Life of the World"

This 3-year grassroots revival was proposed by the Bishops of the United States (USCCB) to revive devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Launched on June 19, 2022, the Feast of Corpus Christi, the theme for the current year through June 2023, is the "Year for Diocesan Renewal", offering events to promote and inspire understanding of the Eucharist.

"According to Pew Research Center, only 31% of Catholics even believe in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist." ⁽¹⁾ The Revival vision is to inspire Catholics who are healed, converted, formed, and unified through encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist to share this relationship "for the life of the world." ⁽²⁾

Misnamed "Respect for Marriage Act" Rejects Meaning of Marriage and Jeopardizes Religious Freedom

The so-called "Respect for Marriage Act," signed into law on Dec.13, 2022, overturns the 1996 Clinton era "Defense of Marriage Act" that said marriage is between one man and one woman. The legislation also codifies same-sex marriage by reinforcing the 2015 Supreme Court ruling making same-sex marriage legal. The Catholic Church is one of several Christian denominations and religions (Orthodox Jewish, Muslim, etc.) that only recognize marriage as a union of one man and one woman. The authors of the newly signed bill claim that it provides protections for religious freedom, but most faith leaders dispute this claim.

The USCCB criticized the Respect for Marriage Act as being contrary to the common good. "The bill fails to include clear, comprehensive, and affirmative conscience protections for religious organizations and individuals who uphold the sanctity of traditional marriage that are needed," said Bishop Robert Barron, chairman of the USCCB committee on laity, marriage, family life and youth. ⁽³⁾ This concern is not unfounded since there have been dozens of instances of government persecution of religious practice in America over the past few years.

"In recent years, the list of parties with religious objections to same-sex marriage who have lost their court battles include Catholic adoption agencies, Jewish universities, and Christian wedding vendors," wrote The Washington Stand. ⁽⁴⁾ This bill would only multiply the occasions whereby people and organizations of faith could be discriminated against or sued.

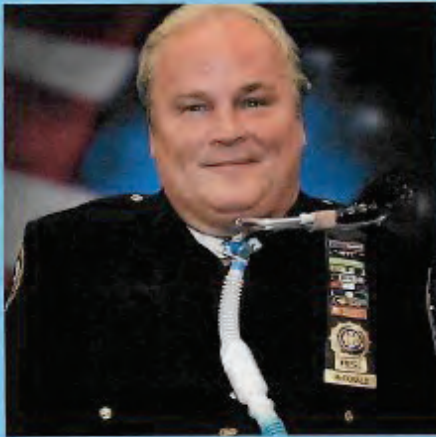

PRACTICE FORGIVENESS

After Steven was shot in Central Park, paralyzed, unable to speak, with his pregnant wife, Patti Ann at his side, he realized he wouldn't live to meet his son if he didn't forgive the 14 year old who shot him. Steven became aware forgiveness was the medicine he needed to live. He publicly forgave Shaved Jones on the day his son was baptized. His statement, read by Patti Ann, moved Jones to call the McDonald home and apologize. Steven was reminded daily what this young man's actions took from him and forgave him everyday. Beyond doctor's expectations, Steven lived over 30 years carrying his cross with Jesus, spreading the message "Why Forgive?"

Steven took 3 STEPS TO FORGIVE:

He named the person he was willing to forgive, acknowledged what was taken from him and prayed for the person by asking God to bless him.

Blessing our enemies after acknowledging what they took from us are the steps needed to free us from the toxicity of bitterness and resentment. Bitterness slowly kills us and blocks the graces God has for us to live an abundant life despite the pain and wounds from the actions of others. When we are reminded of the hurt and wounds caused by others, it is a sign we need to forgive again.
