

"Who do you say that I am?" That question, asked by Jesus to Simon Peter in today's Gospel, sets the stage for a key foundation of the Catholic Church. Once Simon states that Jesus is the Messiah, then Jesus blesses him, changes his name to Peter (which means rock) and says that he will build his church upon that rock, though not on a physical rock, but on Peter, the new rock.

This will be his church—the Catholic Church. Jesus, knowing that he will not be physically present much longer, hands over the "keys of the kingdom" to Peter. In the Bible, the keys are a symbol for the king's prime minister, the caretaker of the kingdom. By giving Peter the keys of the kingdom, Jesus is appointing Peter as his prime minister in the kingdom he is building. From that moment on, Peter and his successors, the **popes**, have held a central leadership role for Christ's Church.

I hope you are enjoying the summer! It is slipping by fast. Next week the teachers and I will be welcoming your children back, and for some for the 1st time, to school.

#### This Year's <u>School</u> Theme Anchored in Faith: We Are All Called to Be Fishers of Men!

Do you know what the earliest Christian symbol was? You might guess the cross. That would certainly be the most popular answer.

Yet that's not the case. Early on, believers were hesitant to display it publicly for fear they would be persecuted for their faith. In fact, it wasn't until the Roman emperor Constantine converted to Christianity in the 4th century that the cross was elevated to symbolic status.

Your second guess for the earliest symbol might be the fish. The Greek



word for fish is "ichthys." As early as the first century, Christians made an acrostic from this word: Iesous Christos Theou Yios Soter, which means Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior. The fish has plenty of other theological overtones as well. Jesus fed the 5000 with five loaves and two fish. He called his disciples "fishers of men." Tradition has it that when a believer approached a stranger and wondered if they were Christian, an arc was drawn in the dust with the foot. If the other party shared the faith, the arc was crossed with another, forming a crude fish.

However, both of these were predated by, of all things, an **anchor**. The anchor became a key Christian symbol during the period of Roman persecution that took the lives of both Saints Peter and Paul. It was sufficiently vague so as to confuse the uninitiated observer.

The symbol of the cross is the symbol that reminds us of how Jesus died for us, we would do well to remember the anchor also. It reflects the mission that we are to go out into the sea of humanity to share the Good News about Jesus Christ.

This year we are going to focus on our mission to be fishers of men, disciples, to not only remember what Jesus did for us, but also as a challenge to rise to what Jesus wants from us through virtuous actions, words, and deeds.

The Kindergarten children should assemble in the school yard behind the school no later than 8:30 A.M. on their 1st day only. Kindergarten parents should be present on their child's first day. In the event of rain, we will assemble in the Carlin Dining Hall. Kindergarten will dismiss at 2:45 P.M. for car riders and bus riders.

On Monday, September 11th, and thereafter, all Kindergarten students should enter the school via the Carlin Doors on Clinton if they are a bus student or the Kindergarten Doors off the playground if they are using the Morning Drop-off. The Kindergarten Aides, Special Content Teachers, and Mrs. Brower will be on Clinton Ave. for the bus students, I will be in the back to assist the Morning Drop-off with additional teachers.

National Catholic Register, Catholic League, Catholic News Agency, Cardinal Dolan, etc. Respond to News of Three FBI Offices Involved in Labeling Traditional Catholics as Radical and **Possible White Supremacists** 

A Jan. 23, 2023, leaked memo from the FBI's Richmond, VA office shocked America's religious leaders and citizens of all faiths by its directing that the FBI should surveil Catholics who attend the Traditional Latin Mass and certain organizations such as The Remnant and Fatima Crusader as possible violent white supremacists. When this memo was leaked the FBI director responded that the memo was not in keeping with the FBI's standards, was the product of one office, Richmond, and would be immediately removed.

However, on July 25, at the insistence of the House Judiciary Committee, the FBI again released their Richmond office's memo with fewer redactions which revealed that FBI offices in Portland and Los Angeles had contributed to the document labeling traditional Catholics as potential domestic terrorists..

Cardinal Timothy Dolan, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Religious Freedom, objected to the document as being offensive, troubling and showing religious profiling. Bishop Barry Knestout of the Diocese of Richmond called out the memo as being in violation of religious freedom and he pointed out that a preference for the traditional Mass of the church and adhering to the church's teachings on marriage, family and human sexuality do not indicate any kind of extremism. He called upon Virginia's elected leaders to condemn this attack on 1<sup>st</sup> amendment religious liberty. The House Judiciary Committee, in light

of this new information, continues its investigation of this matter.






