





#### 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Forgiven Debt





Forgiveness is never easy. We can identify with Peter, who wonders how many times he has to forgive someone who harms him. He had to be shocked when Jesus says seventy-seven times, meaning an unlimited number of times. Since most of us have trouble forgiving even once or twice, such a standard is hard to comprehend. To help Peter, and us, understand that we are to forgive so much because we have been forgiven so much, Jesus tells the parable of the servant who owed a great debt to his master.

When we hear this story, we often miss the magnitude of it because we don't understand the currency. The first servant owed 10,000 talents, which would be about 3.6 billion dollars! When he says he would pay back the debt, Jesus' audience would have realized that was ridiculous. No one could ever repay such a debt. In contrast, the servant himself was owed 100 denari, which would be about \$6,000, a not insubstantial amount, but something that could be repaid in time.

Jesus wants us to realize that our debt to God is like 10,000 talents utterly unpayable and yet God willingly and lovingly forgives as our debt. The things people do to us are like the debt of 100 denari-hurtful and challenging, but not insurmountable. Jesus is telling us that if God can forgive us our enormous debt, we must be willing to forgive the much, much smaller debts owed to us by those who have hurt-us.

When we refuse to forgive, as we learned last week, the grudges we hold become chains that bind us. The more we cling to our unforgiveness, the tighter the chains wrap us and, like the servant who was handed over to the torturers in this week's Gospel, we too are handed over to the torture created by the hardness of our own hearts.

The dust is settling, and the students are continuing to learn their routines and best practices for a successful year.

This week the students in grades 1-8 will participate in the iReady Diagnostic 1 Assessment. The students should come to school well rested, have a nutritious breakfast, and arrive on time with their iPads fully charged and their ear buds and/or headphones.



Defense of the Religious Freedom of Firefighters, High School Football Players, Navy Seals, Catholic Schools and Parishes, Right to Life Groups –

Defended Pro Bono by Law Firms of Dedicated Attorneys

The 1<sup>ST</sup> amendment to the US Constitution definitively protects the conscience rights and free exercise of faith of all Americans. Each year, however, the denials of 1<sup>st</sup> amendment religious freedom become more numerous, unmistakable, and severe. The increased vandalism and destruction of statues, shrines and churches parallels an increasing intolerance for believers and their right to worship, let alone bring their faith into the public square of ideas as was intended by our founders. Founding father John Adams said, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other."

Americans whose religious freedom is denied can contact multiple law firms, mostly supported by donations, which focus on defending their conscience rights as well as their right to openly live their faith in schools, communities, work, the military and the larger public

square.

For example, First Liberty Institute of Plano, TX successfully defended Coach Kennedy, a school football coach fired by his school district for taking a knee after football games to pray, silently and alone, on the 50<sup>th</sup> yard line. Over time players from both teams voluntarily came to join Coach Kennedy in silent prayer. After 7 years of court action the Supreme Court's opinion was that Coach Kennedy and all public-school teachers may engage in brief personal prayer in public view of others, including students.

Another example is the lawsuit filed by Becket Law to gain access for Catholics to Colorado's universal, government funded preschool at the public or private school of the parents' choice. The state, however, denies this benefit to students in Catholic preschools.

Also. Thomas More Society attorneys successfully challenged Illinois state's new law which attacked pro-life maternal healthcare centers. Alliance Defending Freedom attorneys have defended prospective adoptive parents against several states' laws which deny adoption to parents who do not agree with the state's gender ideology. Knowing there is support available to protect religious liberty empowers us to preserve that liberty.
