#### THE WORD BURNING WITHIN

Today's Gospel passage follows directly upon the text from last Sunday, where Peter is raised to the loftiest position in the kingdom after that of Jesus himself. And what do we see this week? He is called "Satan!" Assuming that both of these passages together comprised only several minutes of conversation, Peter must have felt like he was on a roller coaster. Notice that Jesus first talks about the fact that he must suffer. Then, after Peter puts his foot in his mouthprobably quite innocently thinking that he was expressing his love for Jesus-Jesus tells Peter that anyone who would follow him must suffer, too. We can easily misunderstand Jesus to be saving to Peter, or to us, "No, don't you get it? Being crowned and celebrated the messianic king would be bad, and suffering death is good." Jesus isn't really turning the world upside down. He isn't saying that pleasure is bad and pain is good. He is telling us the truth that in a world of sin, love will suffer. And if we choose to love as he did, we suffer as he did.

The first day of school for students in Grades 1-8 is Wednesday, September 6th. The students are to report to their last year's classroom no later than 8:15 A.M. The students should bring their lunch to school. Dismissal is at 2:45 P.M.

Uniforms: Our school uniform provider is Flynn and O'Hara. Uniforms may be purchased in person at the Flynn and O'Hara store in Plainview or online through their website. All students in Grades 1-8 should be in either summer or formal uniform. The summer uniform will be in effect from September 6th to October 15th for those who choose to wear it. Girls' skirts must hit the kneecap. Boys' hair must be short on the top, sides, back, and front. Neat, and well-groomed. No mop-top hairstyle.

New Students in grades 1-7 should report to the Main Office on the first day of school. They will be escorted to the Library for an orientation and then escorted to their classrooms. 

Focus on Religious Freedom

Court Finds Catholic Farm Family Was Wrongfully Denied Access to a Local Farmers Market Because of Their Deeply Held Religious Beliefs

After both served in the military, Steve and Bridget Tennes moved back to the family farm where Steve was born, Country Hill Farms, in Charlotte, MI. The farming life particularly satisfied Steve and Brigid as it gave them the chance to work together and raise their children according to their Catholic beliefs. Their stated mission is to glorify God through their work and so were known to host events which resulted in contributions of thousands of apples to charitable organizations, providing quality, exceptional housing for their seasonal workers and also supporting an organization helping veterans to get a start in farming.

For years they had sold their products at a seasonal farmers market in East Lansing, MI, but were quickly banned from the market when city officials saw a Facebook posting where Steve and Bridget were asked about their beliefs about marriage. True to their Catholic faith, they answered that they believe marriage is between one man and one woman.

Officials from East Lansing saw the post, insisted that the Tennes were not adhering to the city's 's non-discrimination policy and immediately began working to keep the family from participating in the market. A city policy was written specifically targeting the Tennes and then eliminating them as market vendors.

Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF), a Christian legal-advocacy group, represented the Tennes and filed a complaint against the city of East Lansing in 2017. On Aug. 21, 2023, a district court ruled that the city could not deny access to the market to the Tennes based on their religious beliefs. The court said the City had placed "a burden" on the religious beliefs of Steve and Bridget by insisting they choose between their faith and their participation in a public benefit (the city's farmers market).



# **BY PRACTICING FORGIVENESS EVERYDAY**

After Steven was shot in Central Park, paralyzed, unable to speak, with his pregnant wife, Patti Ann at his side, he realized he wouldn't live to meet his son if he didn't forgive the 14 year old who shot him. Steven became aware forgiveness was the medicine he needed to live. He publicly forgave Shaved Jones on the day his son was baptized. His statement, read by Patti Ann, moved Jones to call the McDonald home and apologize. Steven was reminded daily what this young man's actions took from him and FORGAVE HIM EVERYDAY. Beyond doctor's expectations, Steven lived over 30 years carrying his cross with Jesus, spreading the message "Why Forgive?"

Blessing our enemies after acknowledging what they took from us are the steps needed to free us from the toxicity of bitterness and resentment. Bitterness slowly kills us and blocks the graces God has for us to live an abundant life despite the pain and wounds from the actions of others. When we are reminded of the hurt and wounds caused by others, it is a sign we need to forgive again. STEVEN WAS REMINDED EVERYDAY.




