Principal's Announcements



We typically hate

being caught off-guard. In fact, much of our life is about preparation and planning: we schedule events on our calendar; we buy groceries in advance; we dress differently for different activities. Being prepared for life is an essential component of life. Jesus, however, will point us beyond our day-to-day preparations to emphasize how prepared we should be for that final meeting, when he returns as the bridegroom-king.

Jesus teaches us with the parable of the ten virgins—attendants waiting for the wedding feast to begin. After much delay, the bridegroom finally arrives on the scene. Sadly, half of the virgins are caught unaware. They have run out of oil for their lamps. These foolish virgins represent Christians who are not prepared for the Lord's return. Some scholars see the oil as symbolizing the righteous deeds of believers, which the foolish virgins have failed to do.

On the other hand, the wise virgins have been "keeping vigil" for Wisdom (see Wisdom 6:15) and are

ready for his arrival. They are invited into the wedding while the others are stranded outside. The interpretation is simple: we want to be ready, awake, and vigilant for the return of Jesus in order that we might enter into the eternal wedding feast of the Lamb. The finality of eternal punishment is terrifying, but the irrevocability of eternal life is tantalizing.

Our hope is in the Lord, not in ourselves, yet we participate in our own redemption and spiritual growth by our moral action. If we neglect the "oil" of doing good, we will fall into the "sleepiness" of sin.

George Washington - "The liberty enjoyed by the people of these states of worshipping Almighty God, agreeable to their consciences, is not only among the choicest of their blessings, but of their rights."

Our founders established a nation where all religions could be exercised without discrimination or fear of persecution. or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

Our 1st amendment asserts each citizen's right to be free from government-imposed religion and to follow their conscience in the practice of the faith they may choose. The other four freedoms in the first amendment are essential support to Freedom of Conscience/Religion:

Freedom of speech empowers us to speak about our faith, to pray with others and to evangelize our beliefs. Freedom of the press empowers us to print our Bibles and books of prayer and worship and to spread our faith through the printed word.

Freedom to assemble empowers us to come together in our churches, communities and public squares to worship, celebrate and evangelize.

Freedom of redress empowers us to challenge the government when it oversteps the wall of separation clearly described in Thomas Jefferson's letter to the Danbury Baptists, to keep government out of the affairs of each citizen's beliefs and religious practices.

A lack of education in the facts of our freedom of conscience as a founding principle and pillar of our liberties has led to generations of Americans denying religious freedom in our schools, colleges and the public square of ideas and governance. That denial has worsened into intolerance, intimidation, and a shocking and dangerous increase in hate crimes in our nation.


