**Eucharistic Adoration** is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

# Principal's Announcements



Jesus begins today's Gospel with a description of the events that will precede the destruction of the Temple, warning, "Be on your guard. Let no one mislead you." He describes tremendous upheavals as signs of the future. By these signs the disciples are to recognize that the Son of Man is near.

Although the context makes it clear that Jesus is describing events that were to occur prior to the destruction of the Temple in the year 70 A.D., the Church has always seen this passage as a prophecy of the end times as well.

Today's reading, however, highlights not what we can expect at the end of the world, but rather our incapacity to know the time of the Lord's second coming. If we knew when he was coming, we could arrange a convenient conversion and spare ourselves the difficult task of living the Gospel in the meantime. But God teaches us that Gospel living is good in itself—not simply a means with which to buy Heaven.

Watchfulness is, in fact, precisely Gospel living. We watch for occasions of God's grace. We watch for occasions of sin. We watch in prayer as Christ asked us to do. We watch for occasions to love Christ in the least of our brothers and sisters. We watch the Paschal Mystery unfold for us in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We are a people on the watch for the return of our beloved Lord at every moment.

Far from being fatiguing, this is the cause of our

constant joy. If we are on the watch, it is not in fear of his Second Coming, but because we fear missing the one we miss. "Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways" (Isaiah 64:4).

This week the school children will learn about St. Jude, Apostle of the Impossible, and some will have the opportunity to venerate his relics.

CAPS (Child Abuse Prevention Services) will be here this week to present a workshop to the 3rd and 4th Graders entitled Steer Clear of Bullies. This multi-media workshop is designed to promote empathy, social skills building, and assertiveness skills. Thank you, Mrs. Dowdell, for arranging for this workshop for our 3rd and 4th graders.

The 6th Graders will participate in a retreat in the Parish Center this week led by Ms. Tess Austin, the Director of Catholic Identity for the DRVC Department of Education. Ms. Austin will provide a talk about Advent for the 6th graders and help them prepare for Christmas.

# Special Plenary Indulgence Issued by the Vatican for Venerating the Relic of Saint Jude

#### What is a Plenary Indulgence?


A plenary indulgence is an act by the Pope whereby he uses his authority as the successor of Saint Peter to declare the removal of one's accrued purgation to be spent in Purgatory (an instance of the papal "power of the keys" described in Matthew 16:18-19). A Catholic who gains a plenary indulgence receives a blank slate in terms of Purgatory up to the moment of attaining it.

#### The Conditions to Receive the Plenary Indulgence

- 1. Venerate the relics of St. Jude.
- 2. *Pray for the Pope.*Reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary satisfies this condition.
- 3. Receive the Sacrament of Confession within twenty days of visiting the relics.
- 4. Receive Holy Communion within the same twenty days while free from grave sin.
- 5. Resolve to end all relationships with sin, even venial (i.e., non-mortal) sin.

#### For Those for Whom Visiting the Relic is Not Possible Due to Serious Inconvenience

6. Persons of old age, the sick, and all who are unable to leave their home for a serious reason (e.g., travel distance) may likewise gain the plenary indulgence after fulfilling condition #5 above and conditions #2-4 "as soon as possible" and fulfilling the additional condition of "joining themselves spiritually to Saint Jude's holy pilgrimage and offering their prayers, sufferings, and inconveniences to our merciful God."





# The Joy of Christmas Draws Us Closer to Our Infant King and Our Fellow Man



"Mankind is a great, an immense family... This is proved by what we feel in our hearts at Christmas." - Pope John Paul XXIII

Each year in the USA there are organizations, individuals and government officials who would ban or restrict the celebration of Christmas. Already this year an administrator in a Wisconsin city has informed employees that decorations this December should avoid red and green colors and religious themes because she sees that as unwelcoming and not inclusive.

Meanwhile, churches, town squares, parks and other public forum areas are being readied for the celebration of Christmas and the marking of other faiths' celebrations as well. Since the principles of religious freedom prevent the cultural majority from using the power of the state to impose their beliefs on others, both religious and nonreligious alike, the government cannot become so powerful that it can tell people what to think and how to act. (1) This is especially important to know during the Christmas/Hanukkah holiday.

"The U.S. Supreme Court and numerous federal appeals courts have recognized that government entities may recognize Christmas as a holiday and may maintain Christmas displays that include both religious and secular symbols." (1)

"Publicly sponsored Nativity scenes on public property are constitutional, especially when the display includes other secular symbols of the holiday. In fact, removing only the religious symbols of the holiday display would demonstrate hostility toward religion, which the First Amendment forbids," said Liberty Counsel. (2)

For many years residents and visitors to New York City have been inspired by a life-size nativity scene in Central Park, on a piece of public property in front of the Plaza Hotel on 5th Ave. The Catholic League has erected this display for decades. Their president, Bill Donohue, has taught us that a public forum, a place that is open to all ideas, concerts, artistic exhibitions, etc., cannot stop them from erecting the creche.




