Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted) in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Principal's Announcements

3rd Sunday of Advent



May joy dwell in your hearts!

The Gospel this week features John the Baptist again, although we see him in a different light than Mark's Gospel. In St. John's Gospel, the Baptist is the witness to the Messiah; he "was not the light, but came to testify to the light" (John 1:8).

Scholars have noticed that John begins his Gospel with the same phrase as that which begins Genesis: "In the beginning." This suggests a new creation in Christ. Closer attention reveals that John also mentions a series of days in the first two chapters of his Gospel that add up to seven in all! The phrase "the next day" is used three times in chapter one, suggesting the passing of four days, and the story of the wedding feast at Cana in chapter two begins with the words, "On the third day," suggesting the passing of three more days. John describes the beginning of the re-creation in Christ, just as Genesis describes creation itself in a series of seven days.

John the Baptist describes the Messiah as "one among you whom you do not recognize" (John 1:26). This idea of God among us is a central theme of both the Old and New Covenants. God dwelt among his people during the Exodus from Egypt, in the Tabernacle, and in the Temple. Of course, Jesus is our Emmanuel, "God with us," in a special way during Advent. Most profoundly, he is "one among us" in the Eucharist, under the humble form of bread and wine, and as such is often one whom we "do not recognize." Each Holy Communion, then, is a little advent, another coming of Jesus, and so the Advent season ought to teach us how to be better prepared to greet Christ in each Mass.

This is a short week for the students. School is in session for a full day on Monday and Tuesday, and a half-day, 12 noon dismissal, on Wednesday. Christmas Recess will begin at 12 noon on Wednesday, but before

we dismiss, there are some special Christmas events to celebrate.

Ugly Sweater Day! The students should wear their ugliest sweater to school with their gym sweatpants on Monday.



Christmas Pageant: Our 2nd graders will perform their Christmas Pageant on Tuesday. It is always a joyous occasion to see the children proclaim their faith as they act and sing the "Greatest Story Ever Told."

Christmas Mass: On Wednesday the school will gather together to celebrate Mass. We will place the Baby Jesus in the school's Manger and reflect upon the beauty of season:

Love came, held safely within a gentle womb

All the truth, majesty, and creativity of a living God

Poured into a tiny heart

Making a quiet entrance in a dark and uninviting shack Just one star shone anew as a handful of people were brought

Led by angelic voices, and open hearts

A young mother

A faith-filled father


St. Agnes Giving Tree

Part 1: The Twelve Rules of Christmas®

Unfortunately, Christmas has become a time of controversy over what can or cannot be done in terms of celebrating the holiday. To clear up much of the misunderstanding, the following twelve rules are offered:

- 1. Public school students' written or spoken personal expressions concerning the religious significance of Christmas (e.g., T-shirts with the slogan, "Jesus Is the Reason for the Season") may not be censored by school officials absent evidence that the speech would cause a substantial disruption.
- 2. So long as teachers are generally permitted to wear clothing or jewelry or have personal items expressing their views about the holidays, Christian teachers may not be prohibited from similarly expressing their views by wearing Christmas-related clothing or jewelry or carrying Christmas-related personal items.
- 3. Public schools may teach students about the Christmas holiday, including its religious significance, so long as it is taught objectively for secular purposes such as its historical or cultural importance, and not for the purpose of promoting Christianity.
- 4. Public school teachers may send Christmas cards to the families of their students so long as they do so on their own time, outside of school hours.
- 5. Public schools may include Christmas music, including those with religious themes, in their choral programs if the songs are included for a secular purpose such as their musical quality or cultural value or if the songs are part of an overall performance including other holiday songs relating to Chanukah, Kwanzaa, or other similar holidays.
- 6. Public schools may not require students to sing Christmas songs whose messages conflict with the students' own religious or nonreligious beliefs.

La celebración del tercer Domingo de Adviento, llamado también "domingo de gaudete", o de la alegría, por la primera palabra del introito de la Misa: Gaudete, es decir, regocíjense. Isaías y San Pablo son testigos hoy de ese gozo en las lecturas que escucharemos.




