Principal's Announcements



This is the Time!

When we are young, time can seem almost non-existent. It goes so slowly that it can feel like we'll always be alive and young. But as we get older, time seems to speed up. Every year passes more quickly than the last, and the way time seemed to stretch to infinity in our youth seems like an illusion.

Think back to the summers when you were young and you'll remember that illusion. We often find ourselves in that same kind of illusion as Christians. Time still seems never to pass in the sense that we forget to look for the coming of Christ. Every day of our life can blend into the next with no sense of urgency to truly follow Jesus and live the Gospel.

Our readings for today challenge that illusion. Though it can be easy for us to live our days as though Christ hasn't come, he has. And when he came, he fundamentally changed our world and redeemed it. His kingdom has come, and as Christians we are called to shake ourselves from the illusion of this world and to be witnesses to the presence of God that is all around us.



Today is the Feast Day of St. Agnes of Rome: Parton Saint of St. Agnes Cathedral School, Children, and the Diocese of Rockville Centre

From a young age, St. Agnes embraced Christianity, vowing to remain chaste and dedicated to her faith despite societal pressures and persecution for her beliefs. She steadfastly committed herself to Christ throughout her life.

In the face of potential marriage proposals, she prayed fervently to maintain her purity and commitment to Christ. It is said that an admirer who sought to marry Agnes was struck blind when he attempted to violate her vow. In another version, Agnes prayed for her hair to grow miraculously to cover her modesty when she was exposed to potential shame. These miraculous

occurrences are often cited as symbols of divine protection and the manifestation of God's intervention in Agnes' life. The legends surrounding St. Agnes highlight her unwavering faith, purity, and the miraculous events attributed to her, contributing to her status as a revered Christian saint and martyr. St. Agnes of Rome became such a popular saint that many converted to Christianity!





After Steven was shot in Central Park, paralyzed, unable to speak, with his pregnant wife, Patti Ann at his side, he realized he wouldn't live to meet his son if he didn't forgive the 14 year old who shot him. Steven became aware forgiveness was the medicine he needed to live. He publicly forgave Shaved Jones on the day his son was baptized. His statement, read by Patti Ann, moved Jones to call the McDonald home and apologize. Steven was reminded daily what this young man's actions took from him and FORGAVE HIM EVERYDAY. Beyond doctor's expectations, Steven lived over 30 years carrying his cross with Jesus, spreading the message "Why Forgive?"

Blessing our enemies after acknowledging what they took from us are the steps needed to free us from the toxicity of bitterness and resentment. Bitterness slowly kills us and blocks the graces God has for us to live an abundant life despite the pain and wounds from the actions of others. When we are reminded of the hurt and wounds caused by others, it is a sign we need to forgive again. STEVEN PRACTICED FORGIVENESS EVERYDAY.

The 1st Amendment's religious freedom clauses direct the federal government not to favor or impose one particular faith and to protect the free exercise of all faiths.






