Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.



Principal's Announcements

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is hinted at in the very beginning of Mark's Gospel that Jesus passed his authority on to the Church because Jesus



made Capernaum his new home. Capernaum is Peter's city and Jesus, after leaving the synagogue which was the scene of last week's Gospel reading (in which he cast out a demon), goes "immediately" to Simon's house. If we remember that Mark is writing for Gentiles, the very phrase, "And immediately he left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon" suggests the course that the followers of Jesus are themselves going to follow. They too will leave the synagogue and enter Peter's house: the Church. It is significant, too, that Jesus spends the first Sunday recorded in the Gospel curing Simon's mother-in-law and the afflicted and casting out demons within Simon's house.

Though we may never fully understand suffering, we can be certain that God desires to heal us and bring value into our suffering. He sent us his only Son to suffer and die for our salvation, and through this mystery we can glimpse how suffering can make us more like him. But we first need to ask for him to heal us in our suffering. We see Jesus beginning that work today in the little town of Capernaum, and he longs to continue that same work in each of our lives.

Last Sunday we hosted our annual Open House. I am grateful to all the teachers, staff, parents, and students who participated in our Open House. It was a wonderful reflection of what the St. Agnes Cathedral School Community stands for: family, love, support, and friendship. I am truly grateful to all who assisted in my absence.

Registration for incoming students for the 2024-25 school year was last week as well. If you were not able to register your child, please call the school office at 516-678-5550 to set up an appointment to register your child. The following documents are needed for registration: Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate, if applicable, current report card and standardized testing for students in grades 1-7, and parish envelope number,

if applicable. Students entering kindergarten must be 5 years old by December 1, 2024. The following are non-refundable fees due at the time of registration:

Kindergarten: \$300.00 (\$150.00 registration and \$150.00 tuition deposit Grades 1-7: \$150.00.

Tuition assistance is available through Tomorrow's Hope Foundation. The 2024-2025 Tomorrow's Hope Foundation/ FACTS scholarship application opened on January 16th. Applications are due by April 30th. Screening for incoming Kindergarten students is this week on February 5th, 6th and 7th. The screening is approximately 30 minutes. Parents and their child should report to the school's Main Office at your scheduled time.

The 7th grade students will participate in a very cool field trip this week. They will travel to the only White House Replica in the Northeast to see a life-size reproduction of the White House with an Oval Office, Situation Room, and Press Briefing Room. They will play the role of the U.S. president, White House Cabinet, and Press Reporters as they navigate a "crisis" using award-winning simulations from the Council on Foreign Relations Education. I am so excited for the students to experience this trip.

The students in grades 3-5 will also participate in field trips this week. They will learn about the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics involved in skating.

Friday, February 9th is a half day to enable the teachers and I to meet for our monthly faculty meeting. We will be analyzing our most recent iReady diagnostic result.



Thinking about 1st Amendment Religious Liberty after the Jan.16 USCCB's Annual Report on the State of Religious Liberty in the United States

In response to the United States Bishops' concerns about religious liberty in our Nation, Catholics can support their efforts and follow the God given charism to the laity of taking our faith into the public square by learning the facts and rights of our Constitutional freedoms of conscience and religion.

The 1st Amendment to the U.S. Constitution is direct and definitive.


"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

The concerns of the bishops and millions of Americans originate in a culture which now marginalizes faith and religion, shows growing contempt and intolerance for people of faith, tolerates unsolved crimes of vandalism on hundreds of churches and pregnancy centers and has not stood up as one people to condemn the FBI's investigation of Catholics attending the Traditional Latin Mass. Most Americans are unaware that this administration has proposed a Health and Human Services regulation which the bishops reported would force doctors to perform transgender surgeries and may also include a mandate to perform abortions.

An added concern reported since the bishops' report of Jan. 16, is that the House Judiciary Committee revealed documents in which FinCEN (the U.S. Treasury's Financial Crimes Enforcement Unit) asked financial institutions to track customer's transactions for the purchase of religious texts, including the Bible as well as guns, travel tickets, purchases at Cabela's, Bass Pro Shops, etc. FinCEN said those purchases could be "extremist indicators."




