Principal's Announcements

In today's Gospel the Pharisee Nicodemus has come to Jesus at nighttime to ask him questions about who he is and where he comes from. Jesus explains that the ancient bronze serpent Moses made served as a foreshadowing of his role as Savior. While the ancient Israelites had to look at the bronze serpent on a pole to be healed from snake-bites, Jesus will be "lifted up" on a cross. To be saved from the "snake-bite" of sin, we must look to him, raised up on the Cross.

Then Jesus hands us the heart of the Gospel message—that God loved us and sent his Son that we might come to believe in him and so gain eternal life. God does not want to condemn us but heal us and rescue us from sin. Yet, unfortunately, many of us will run from the light rather than turn toward the light. Jesus predicts that many will prefer the darkness and deliberately avoid believing in Jesus so that they do not have to change their behavior: "Their deeds were evil" (John 3:19).

Our behavior and our belief go hand-in-hand, just as Paul shows in the reading from Ephesians. If we do evil deeds, we will want to hide them in the darkness, but if we do "what is true" then we will come to the Light himself and be saved by him. Those who believe look to the Lord shun the darkness and live their lives in the light.





Join the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage May 17- July 16, 2024 Public Witness Across America to the Real Presence in the Eucharist

Since the National Eucharistic Revival was launched in Oct.,2022 under the leadership and guidance of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), dioceses and their parishes across this country have hosted worship, education and inspiration events to restore understanding and devotion to the mystery and the miracle of Christ present in the Eucharist.

Bishop Robert Barron, renowned theologian and expert on St. Thomas wrote this in summary of Aquinas' Eucharistic Theology: "The Eucharist, above any other Sacrament or sign, contains and causes Grace. Just as food sustains, repairs and delights the body, so the Eucharist sustains, repairs and delights the soul. Without the body of Christ, the spiritual life in us would be compromised by sin, become atrophied and flattened out, and finally would fade away altogether." (Diocese of Venice, Fl; Faith Formation Series)

After this period of renewal of our Eucharistic devotion, all Catholics have the opportunity to offer public witness to our belief and devotion to Christ in the Eucharist. The experience of this National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will change lives forever. Walking, standing and praying openly in the public square has been a practice of Catholics for Freedom of Religion (CFFR) throughout the twelve years of our ministry to our fellow Catholics.

When CFFR first stood together with 700 Catholics in public witness of prayer outside of a Catholic Hospital on Long Island...praying for the preservation of Catholic healthcare in spite of government mandates that would deny the conscience rights of the hospitals, schools, universities and business owners...we did not foresee the intensity of that experience for our organizers and the participants. There is truly a boldness in action and an inexplicable strengthening of faith and resolve when we witness together the truths of our faith.

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: <u>www.Virtus.org</u> When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.

- a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
- b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
- c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
- d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
- Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
- After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.

2. Background Screening Application:

- Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
- Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
- c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
- d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

MISAS EN ESPAÑOL, Sábado – a las 7.30pm (Misa del Domingo) Martes - a las 7.30pm (comenzando con el Rosario y confesión a las 7.00pm)

Bienvenidos a la celebración de la santa misa, ahora ene cuarto domingo de Cuaresma, llamado también «Laetare» (Alégrate), por las primeras palabras del Introito de la Misa, "Laetare Jerusalem" ("Alégrate, oh, Jerusalén")

El pensamiento central de este domingo es este: Dios quiere salvarnos por amor. Envió a su Hijo al mundo no para condenar sino para salvar. Esta fe en la voluntad salvífica de Dios proclamamos firmemente al comienzo de la celebración.

Por amor, Dios perdona al pueblo a pesar de su infidelidad y le permite regresar del exilio, como leemos en el pasaje del libro de las Crónicas. Y tanto amó Dios al mundo que entregó a la muerte a su Hijo para que creyendo en él tengamos vida eterna, dice el pasaje del evangelio. La misma idea recoge el texto de la carta a los Efesios: por amor, cuando estábamos muertos por el pecado, él nos devolvió la vida con la resurrección de Jesús. Atentos escuchemos este mensaje.

Tras la intervención de Jesús en el templo, que veíamos el domingo pasado, llegamos al relato del encuentro con Nicodemo. En este cuarto domingo de Cuaresma, vamos a leer la parte final de ese pasaje: la invitación del Maestro a creer en él para tener vida eterna
