

Principal's Announcements

Today's Gospel reading finds Jesus in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. A group of Greek worshippers, who regularly attended the synagogue, seek to speak with Jesus. When Jesus hears of it, since the inclusion of the Gentiles would be the final stage of God's plan of salvation, he solemnly announces "the hour has come." He means that the moment of the fulfillment of his earthly mission is at hand, the "hour" that had been delayed up until this point Jesus cryptically predicts his own Death and Resurrection again with the metaphor of the wheat grain.

He acknowledges a universal truth that applies in a particular way to himself at this time, that if you "love your life," then you will lose it, but if you "hate your life," you will keep it. He does not mean we should all be miserable but that we should be willing to lay down our lives, to "hate" our lives, for the sake of a greater purpose, for God's glory.

Jesus then notes his own emotional disturbance over the prospect of death but resolves to go through with it. Indeed, he says "for this purpose I have come to this hour," meaning that all of his messianic mission has been leading up to this point, the time of his Passion and Death. Once he affirms his resolve, God speaks from Heaven for all to hear. The witnesses marvel at the voice while Jesus explains he will be "lifted up" on the Cross as he had earlier indicated and thus draw everyone to himself.

This week the Mothers' Club is sponsoring Read-A-Thon Week. Each day the children will participate in reading activities that will promote reading, including a night at Barnes and Noble and a character parade.







The Call for Our Time: Defend Life and Religious Liberty

Whether the issue of religious freedom/freedom of conscience is the right to teach our children the faith, not being forced to fund abortion, evangelization, assembling for worship, the integrity of the words of the Bible, witnessing and advocating our faith and morals in the public square, operating foster parent adoption agencies, soup kitchens, homeless shelters, drug addiction services, etc., all Americans benefit from the God-given right of religious freedom. Our founders agreed with James Madison, "Conscience is the most sacred of all property."


The Declaration of Independence asserts that we have inalienable rights from our Creator and that government's role is to protect those rights. Differing from the history of nations world-wide, the citizens of the new United States claimed the natural rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness from their Creator, free from dictates by a king, emperor or all-powerful government.

We are, more than ever, experiencing unrelenting pressures to yield our right to follow our conscience in the choice for life. The ability to choose life, from conception to natural death, can be regulated and legislated away from us (by the proposed Equity Act) if freedom of conscience and religion are not preserved. Doctors, nurses and hospitals could be required, under proposed legislation, to participate in abortions as part of their licensing, and they could be required to implement certain end of life protocols which some see as denial of treatment.

Since the Supreme Court's decision that there is no federal Constitutional right to abortion and therefore abortion laws are the purview of each state, those who demand unrestricted abortion are working feverishly within states for abortion on demand. Each American has the duty to learn and preserve our religious freedom's right of conscience for ages and millions yet unborn.

MISAS EN ESPAÑOL, Sábado - a las 7.30pm (Misa del Domingo) Martes - a las 7.30pm (comenzando con el Rosario y confesión a las 7.00pm)

Celebramos el Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma; cercana ya la fiesta de Pascua, la celebración litúrgica de hoy es una invitación gozosa a reflexionar sobre el misterio de nuestra vida hecho fecunda por Cristo. El grano de trigo muere pero después se multiplica en nuevas formas de vida.

La carta a los Hebreos nos habla de sus «gritos y lágrimas» ante la certeza de su muerte. En tres domingos sucesivos se nos presentan -en este ciclo Botros tantos símbolos expresivos que nos permiten entender mejor el misterio de la Pascua del Señor: el templo que él reedificará en tres días, la serpiente levantada que cura a quien le mira con fe, y hoy el grano de trigo, una imagen muy conocida en el mundo rural de Palestina, con la que Jesús nos explica el sentido de su misión, muerte y resurrección.




