Pastoral Care of the Sick

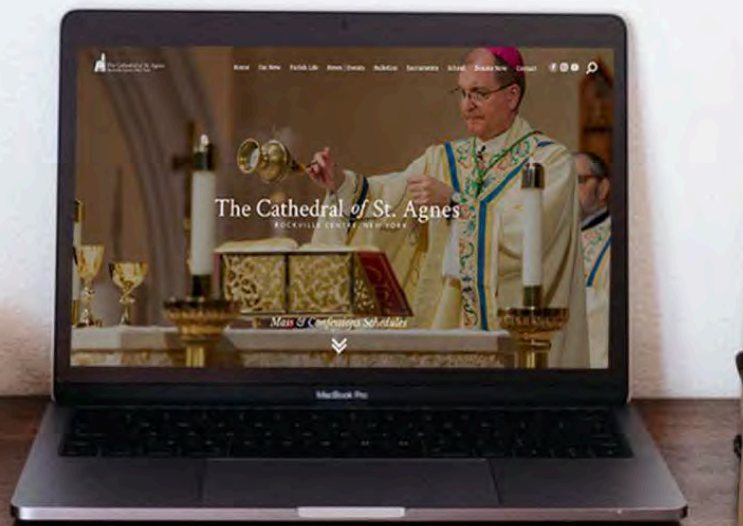

Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

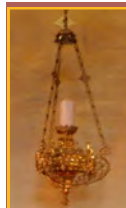

Fifth Sunday of Easter



Abide in Me

Last Sunday, Jesus referred to himself as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Today, he uses the imagery of the vine, the source of divine life for all who believe in him and obey his Word. This passage is a lesson to abide in Jesus to achieve fruitful discipleship. Jesus wants to teach his Apostles about discipleship to help prepare them to carry on the mission following his death. Jesus discloses that the key to fruitful discipleship is to abide in him. Only those who abide in him will bear fruit, but they will be pruned so they can become even more fruitful. Branches that do not bear fruit will be cut off and burned.

The vine analogy highlights the promise of the beautiful intimacy that Jesus offers to all those who believe in him but also the horror that awaits those who reject him. When we abide in Jesus and nurture our relationship with him, he abides in us and gives us the grace to bear fruit for the kingdom. Further, this mutual abiding is the necessary source of our prayer life so that our wills become aligned with God who will provide what we ask. Yet, we must expect some pruning along the way in the form of challenges and obstacles so that we continue to grow. Bearing good fruit is proof of our discipleship.

Since the Father is glorified in the Son, and as his disciples, we share the same mission with Christ, our fruitfulness glorifies the Father.

In contrast, those who reject Christ, the life-giving bone, will bear no fruit and will be cut off and thrown into the fire, perhaps an allusion to Hell.

This week class 5-2 and 5-4 will participate in a field trip to Jones Beach and the 3rd Graders are going to Safety Town. The 8th Graders will participate in a Graduation Retreat at Kellenberg Memorial High School.

The NYS Math Exam will be administered to the 6th graders this week. They should come to school well-rested, have a nutritious breakfast, and arrive on time with their iPads fully charged.

On Thursday, the 2nd Graders will participate in a Communion Retreat right here in the school. The week will end with a Mother-Daughter Tea sponsored by the Mothers' Club on Saturday, May 4th.

The St. Agnes Music Department will continue the tradition of presenting great sacred classical music masterworks with the performance of these two gems, composed for choir, orchestra, and soloists. Vivaldi's setting of the Gloria takes on the form of an extended cantata, where the various parts of the text are given a separate movement. Vivaldi composed this setting of the Gloria text when working at the famous orphanage turned music school: the Ospedale della Pieta in Venice, Italy.

Bach's setting of the Magnificat takes a similar format of dividing up the texts for the purposes of creating individual movements. Bach was newly appointed to the St. Thomas Church (Thomaskirche), Leipzig, Germany, when the 1st performance took place in 1723, 300 years ago this past year! The orchestration is a delight to hear, as are the choral and vocal solo parts. The challenging Baroque music is further decorated by the use of five-part singing of the Choir (SSATB)!

Heckler's Veto: Cancelling (Veto) of Free Speech Accomplished by Loud/ Intimidating/ Violent Hecklers

Apr. 18, 2024. In what is called a major win for free speech, a pro-life protestor was reading the Bible aloud, in a conversational tone, on the same street as an anti-Dobbs protest and a few days later at a Pride-Fest rally. In spite of police acting to stop him, his right to speak his views publicly and peaceably was upheld by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth District. *Meinecke v. City of Seattle* <https://tinyurl.com/53xrfzms>

Police had asked the protestor to stop reading and/or move to another location saying that he was causing a disruption to the ongoing events and there could be violence as a result of his reading. Some rally attendees tried to intimidate him, to drown out his reading, stole one of his Bibles, poured water on another Bible and knocked him down. Instead of arresting those who assaulted the protestor, police detained him and charged him with obstruction.

The Ninth Circuit judges found the man's 1st Amendment freedom of speech had been "burdened" by the police asking him to leave the area and then arresting him for "obstruction" even though he was on a public sidewalk peacefully expressing his views. The court stated that whether the listeners found his views offensive or even hateful did not negate the protestor's right to speak as he did.

Had the protestor complied with the police's request for him to stop reading or move to another space, the court said that would have constituted a "Heckler's Veto." We see Heckler's Vetoes often on college campuses when invited speakers are prevented from speaking by raucous, completely disruptive behavior and threats that stop any message of the invited speaker.

The judges concluded: "If speech provokes wrongful acts on the part of the hecklers, the government must deal with those wrongful acts directly; it may not avoid doing so by suppressing the speech." *Meinecke v. City of Seattle*; Page 4
