Principal's Announcements

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel passage, where Jesus heals a deaf and mute man, offers a profound insight into the process of conversion.



The scene unfolds in four stages: the man's need, his request for healing, his encounter with Christ, and his proclamation of what Christ has done for him.

First, the deaf man recognizes his need for Jesus. His physical inability to hear symbolizes our spiritual deafness to God's ways, and his muteness represents our inability to share the Good News, even when we have received it. The crowd brings him to Jesus, showing their recognition of His spiritual authority. Jesus then takes the man aside privately and touches his ears and tongue with His own saliva. Instead of offering a prayer, He issues a powerful command: "Be opened!"

This command reveals Jesus as the Son of God, divine and Lord over all creation. His authority is evident. The man is healed in fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy, signaling that the time of restoration for Israel has come. Christ's touch allows the man to hear and speak, reflecting our own spiritual journey. When we come to faith, we truly "hear" the Word of God for the first time and then begin to "speak" about it to others. The crowd's astonishment leads them to share the Good News with others. Like the deaf man, we too are called to recognize our need for Jesus, seek His help, encounter Him in the sacraments, and proclaim His message.





Distortion of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act Forces Employers to be Complicit in Abortion... A Direct Denial of 1st Amendment Freedom of Conscience Explains the Bishops' Report on the "State of Religious Liberty in the United States."

When the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act was proposed in Congress, the Bishops of the United States supported the original provisions and intent of the act. The act was proposed to insure that pregnant women were accommodated in the workplace as needed for their health and comfort during pregnancy and after childbirth. Included possible accommodations for pregnant workers were longer work breaks, providing a stool for support while working, more frequent opportunity for beverages and food, temporary modification of work requirements that might be overly strenuous or tiring, more frequent bathroom breaks and accommodation for physician appointments,

The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) approved and encouraged the originally proposed legislation as being pro-woman as well as child and family friendly. However, the final text of the bill included treatment and time off for pregnancy related conditions but also for abortion. The Bishops object, as do many other pro-freedom of conscience parties, because the Act would force employers, even religious employers, to be complicit in abortion against their conscience rights.

In August, 2024, Bishop Michael F. Burbridge, chairman of the Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities said that enabling abortion would be a complete distortion of this legislation which received bipartisan support because it did not include abortion.


