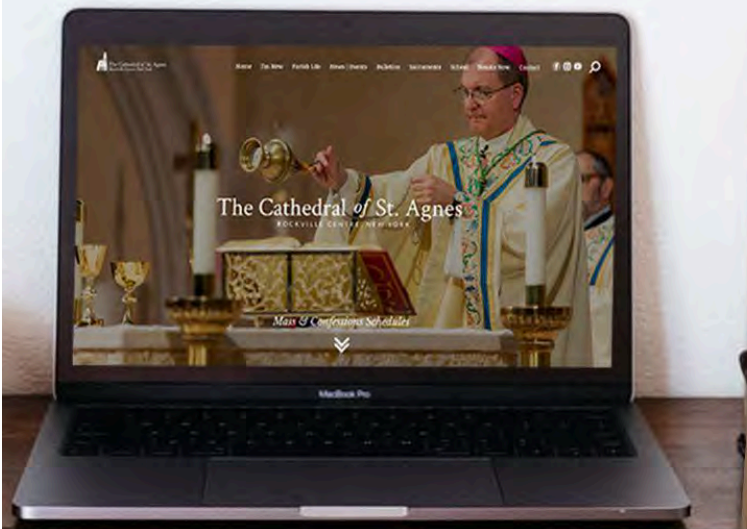

Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Principal's Announcements

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Today's Gospel reading demonstrates the humanity of the Apostles and the divinity of Christ. How many times have we, like James and John, asked for special treatment from God? Although we know that this mentality is often motivated by selfish desires, most of us still engage in "special pleading." Jesus understands our human nature, and rather than admonishing the Apostles for their request of the places at His right and left in glory, He does respond to the petition made by James and John, although not as they might have hoped. "You do not know what you are asking." God may respond in a similar way to many of our requests. God is more intimate to us than we are to ourselves, which means that he knows exactly what we need. It's often said that we must be careful about what we pray for because we might just receive it.

He declines their request for places of honor, however, because this is the gift given by the Father. While there is an element of pride in the request of the disciples, it is a testament to their beginning recognition that Christ is the King. The Apostles themselves were charged with

passing on the content of the Gospel because of their close relation with Jesus.

We find in the disciples the story of the people of Israel. The Israelites, even though they were God's chosen people, were slow to follow his commandments; in fact, they would suffer the great consequence of exile because they failed to follow God's laws. Thus, here again in the disciples, we see the repetition of the story of Israel. The disciples are proud and want to guarantee their own places in the Kingdom of Heaven. What they do not realize is that this is within God's divine providence, but they must undergo great suffering before they can be with Christ in Heaven. It is much the same with us: while we might think that we can take the easy path to merit a place in Heaven, it is actually by the holy road of the Cross, that we attain the Beatific Vision. Let us then, unlike the Israelites, follow Christ as he carries his Cross, so that we might be with him someday in Heaven.

There is no school on Monday, October 21st for the students. The teachers and I will engage in a full day of professional development and iReady data analysis.

“Average Joe”

Football Coach, Joe Kennedy, Champions Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech

A seven year court battle ending with a Supreme Court victory would have been the very last competition a high school assistant football coach would have anticipated. One such coach, Coach Joe Kennedy of Bremerton High School, Bremerton WA, learned that his unsought battle to preserve his Constitutional rights to free speech and the exercise of his faith in public could benefit millions.

When Coach Kennedy made a personal commitment to give glory to God by kneeling in a silent, personal prayer on the 50 yard line after each game, his employer denied his right to pray in the view of the public and fired him for exercising his first amendment rights.

Although no students were asked or directed to join the coach in prayer, as confirmed by the district, some students did so. Even students from other teams, some visiting coaches and members of the public would join Coach Kennedy on the field for a brief, silent, individual prayer.

Coach Kennedy’s victory for religious freedom, which will benefit aspects of religious freedom for millions was achieved through his faith, determination and knowledge of religious freedom with support from his wife and his attorneys.

Coach Kennedy’s case, presented by First Liberty Institute attorneys, was heard by the Supreme Court which issued a 6-3 opinion on June 27, 2022 affirming Coach Kennedy could take a knee in silent prayer even if he can be seen by students and the public.

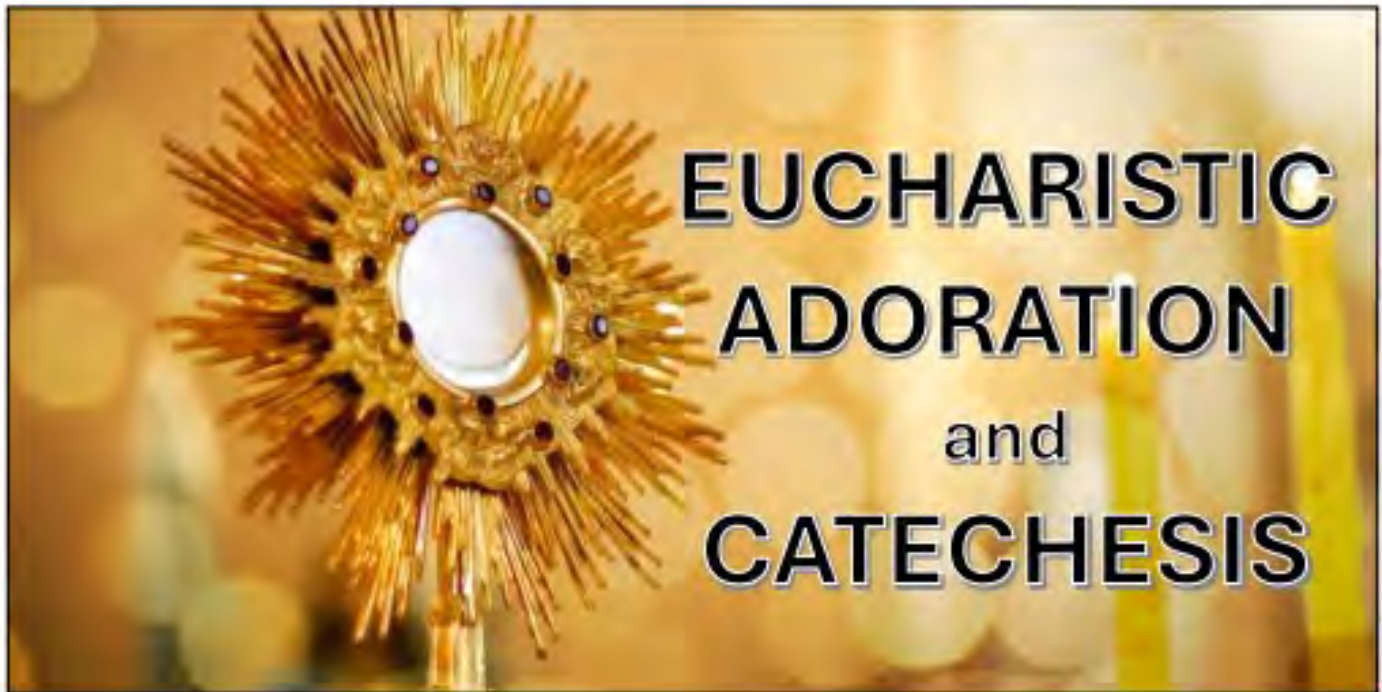
