
#### Marriage

You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.



## Principal's Announcements



#### THE FACE OF GOD



The imagery of sight and blindness is a powerful theme in this Sunday's readings, serving as a metaphor to help us understand how sin blinds us, and how we

are in desperate need of Christ's light to guide us. In modern society, freedom is often understood as the ability to do whatever we want, as long as we don't harm others. However, this view distorts the Christian understanding of freedom and sin. If we adopt the modern definition of freedom, it implies that there is no such thing as sin—because as long as our actions don't directly harm someone else, they are morally neutral. But this is not how sin is understood in the Catholic faith.

In Catholic teaching, freedom is not about doing whatever we want; it is about being able to do the good, freely and without constraint. True freedom grows as we resist evil and make choices that reflect God's will. Sin, in this view, is never merely a private matter. It damages our relationship with God, disrupts our unity with others, and ultimately harms ourselves. The Bible frequently describes attachment to sin as blindness: the more we sin, the less we are able to perceive the truth clearly. Our moral vision becomes clouded, and we lose sight of God's plan for us. But through Jesus Christ, we are offered the chance to overcome this blindness and step into the light of truth.

In Mark's Gospel, the story of Bartimaeus, the blind man, beautifully illustrates this transformation. Mark is the only Gospel writer who names the blind man, calling him Bartimaeus, which means "son of Timothy." He also uniquely records the crowd's encouragement when Jesus calls Bartimaeus, saying, "Take heart; rise, he is calling you." At this moment, Bartimaeus, filled with hope, "threw aside his cloak, jumped up, and came to Jesus." The immediacy of his response underscores Mark's emphasis on the powerful, transformative action

of Jesus. Immediately after his encounter with Christ, Bartimaeus "received his sight and started to follow him on the road."

Mark's use of the word "immediately" throughout his Gospel highlights the urgency of the coming Kingdom of God. In the healing of Bartimaeus, we see how Christ's light can suddenly and completely restore us, helping us to see the truth and follow Him more closely. This passage calls us to recognize our own blindness caused by sin and to respond to Christ's call, throwing aside whatever keeps us in the darkness, and stepping into the freedom and light He offers.

This week the 6th Grade will participate in a field trip to Cold Spring Harbor and learn how forensic scientists analyze materials to understand ancient life and then use these techniques to examine Ötzi, the Iceman. Using microscopes to analyze fabric, hair, and fur from different animals, the students will identify which materials the Iceman used for his Neolithic wardrobe and toolkit.

Thursday, October 31st is Halloween. Students in grades K-3 should wear their Halloween costumes to school. To ensure comfort after the parade and magic show, students may wear comfortable clothes underneath their costumes, allowing them to easily change into those clothes once the festivities are over.

Students in grades 4-8 have an orange and black dress down day on Halloween. No need to wear the gym uniform.

Friday, November 1st, is All Saints' Day, a Holy Day of Obligation. The students will attend Mass, during which our newest Altar Servers will be recognized.

School will dismiss at noon on Friday to allow the faculty and administration to participate in our monthly meeting.

#### Forming Faithful Consciences to Choose God's Truth with Faith, Love and Courage

From the teaching of Pope St. John Paul II: "We are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the `culture of death' and the `culture of life'. ....we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life."

Pope John Paul II, Evangelium vitae, (Vatican City: Libreria Editrice Vaticana, 1995), no. 28

On Mar. 13, 2007, Pope Benedict XVI issued an Apostolic Exhortation, Sacramentum Caritatis, which speaks directly to each Catholic challenged to navigate the secular culture while holding to the teachings of the Catholic church. Sacramentum Caritatis teaches us, "Worship pleasing to God can never be a purely private matter, without consequences for our relationships with others," he said, "it demands a public witness to our faith." "Evidently, this is true for all the baptized, yet it is especially incumbent upon those who, by virtue of their social or political position, must make decisions regarding fundamental values, such as respect for human life, its defense from conception to natural death, the family built upon marriage between a man and a woman, the freedom to educate one's children and the promotion of the common good in all its forms." "These values," he said, "are not negotiable."

Pope Benedict XVI, Sacramentum Caritas, (Vatican City, Libreria Editrice Vaticana, 2007) Section 83

Once again the USCCB has affirmed in their document Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship that even as we must do all we can to address the many ways human life is threatened, "abortion remains our pre-eminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone." Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility from the Catholic Bishops of the United States, Introductory Letter, p.8. (Washington D.C.: United States Conference of Catholic Bishops 2024)

As we faithful Catholics go to the polls on November 5, we are called upon to put aside personal feelings and personality preferences and to exercise our well-formed consciences as we make our choices in public witness to the teachings of our faith.


