Special Music & Concerts During the 2024 - 2025 Season

We are now into the third decade of special concerts and services of music at Saint Agnes Cathedral! While there have been concerts in Saint Agnes for many, many years (under the direction of Mrs. Bertha Reilly, Msgr. Williams, Mr. Paul LaMedica, and Mr. Christoph Tietze, to name a few past directors), the present organization of these events came about in 2000, when our magnificent new pipe organs were built. In addition to hundreds of liturgies, the musicians of Saint Agnes, along with outstanding visiting artists, present concerts and special music to enhance the musical and spiritual life of our community. Many of the concerts feature our wonderful pipe organ and at least one of our choirs. Please plan to attend these wonderful events, which are designed to appeal to a variety of ages and musical tastes.

We are especially grateful to all who have collaborated on presenting these events: The Nassau Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and the Rockville Centre Guild for the Arts.

The year will open with an organ concert featuring our very own associate music director, who is a concert organist as well (Maura Goodwin), which will take place on Sunday, October 20, followed by the performance of selections from Gabriel Faure's "Requiem" in the context of our 12:30 All Souls' Day Mass (November 2), and our Annual Girls Choirs Investiture and Mass on November 16!

On the Sunday evenings of Advent, we will have Sung Solemn Vespers (3rd Sunday evening-Gaudete Sunday with choir as well!) On Monday, January 13, we will host the Harvard University Glee Club in Concert!

To commemorate the Solemnity of Saint Agnes, our Patroness, there will be a Solemn Mass, and Solemn Vespers on January 20 & 21, 2025: On March 16, we'll have the Choir of Men and Boys' annual Investiture Ceremony and Mass. On the five Sunday evenings of Lent as well as Palm Sunday, we will have Sung Solemn Vespers (4th Sunday evening-Laetare Sunday with choir as well!). On Wednesday of Holy Week: April 16, there will be the Office of Tenebrae.

On Friday evening, May 16, there will be a 65th anniversary of the Choir of Men and Boys, with an alumni gathering and performance of the present choir. The South Shore Symphony will return for a performance on June 1. And on Sunday, June 22, there will be a Farewell Performance and Thank-you Reception for the Cathedral Choir Members traveling to Paris France (July 1-10)

As well as these special presentations, the choirs, cantors, organists and musicians prepare and help us to pray with BEAUTIFUL music throughout the year, each and every Sunday, holy days (Christmas and Easter), Thanksgiving, Confirmations, First Holy Communions, etc.!

We look forward to seeing you at many of these liturgies and events, and having the opportunity to thank you for your support to our Music Ministry!

Maura Goodwin is the Associate Director of Music at S Agnes Cathedral, in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, NY, joinir the Music Team in 2018. Miss Goodwin is the Director of the Cathedral Junior and Senior Girls' Choirs, and the Cathedral Children's Choir, where she teaches nearly 100 girls from first to eighth grade, singing for Sundays, special liturgies and their annual concert. She also accompanies the various choirs at th cathedral under the direction of Michael L Bower



As a graduate of Franciscan University of Steubenville, Ohio, Maura received degrees in Sacred Music and Theology, studying the organ under Nicholas Will. She obtained her Master's Degree in Sacred Music at Duquesne University, studying the organ under Dr. Ann Labounsky. She also received choral instruction from Dr. Caron Daley

At St. Agnes Cathedral, Maura has been involved in the production of major performances including Mozart's and Faure's Requiem, Mahler's Symphony No. 3, as well as Handel's Messiah and Mahler's Symphony No. 2. Maura also loves early music and is the Director of the Metropolitan Catholic Chorale, a mixed choral ensemble that sings Gregorian Chant and Sacred Polyphony in the context of the Sacred Mass. She also directs a small schola once a month at Our Holy Redeemer Parish in Freeport. Maura is excited to share her love for Sacred Music through her organ performance!

Sung Solemn Vespers on Advent Sunday Evenings Sundays, December 1, 8, 15*, 22 4:30 PM



The Advent season is a time of "devout and expectant delight" as the Church prepares for the celebration of Christmas. We prepare ourselves to celebrate Christ's first coming by reminding ourselves of his Second Coming at the

Each Sunday evening during the Advent season, we will pray Vespers, the Evening Prayer of the Church keeping watch for our Lord when he comes again. The prayer we send up becomes "like incense in the Lord's sight." Psalm 141.2)

The prayer, which comes from the Church's Liturgy of the Hours, is primarily scripturally based, featuring the chanting of the psalms, reading rom scripture, prayers of intercession as well as the singing of hymns and anticles. A homily will be preached each evening.

* On the third Sunday of Advent (December 15), Gaudete Sunday, the celebration of Vespers will be further enhanced with choral singing

The Harvard University Glee Club Monday, January 13, 7:30 PM

The Harvard Glee Club is America's oldest collegiate choir and has carried on the tradition of tenor-bass choral music since 1858. Guided by our four cardinal virtues of glee, good humor, unity, and joy, the Glee Club cultivates and sustains the art of tenor-bass choral music across centuries of tradition

The Harvard Glee Club regularly performs at Harvard's Sanders Theatre and undertakes both domestic and international tours. In 2023, the Glee Club performed to sold-out crowds in venues such as the Duomo Di Firenze in Florence and St. Bartholomew the Great in London while on a seven-city, five-country tour of Europe. While in Europe, the group also gave joint performances with Milan's renowned Coro CET, a traditional Italian tenor-bass choir, and the Universitäts Chor München in Ludwig Maximilian University's storied concert hall, the Große Aula. Other recent tours have seen the Glee Club perform for audiences in the Dominican Republic, Korea, Japan, and Miami, Minneapolis, and elsewhere throughout the United States and world. Across our history, we have recorded with artists such as Leonard Bernstein, published our arrangements in our own series with the Schirmer Company, and given numerous performances in venues such as Boston's Symphony Hall, Washington D.C.'s Kennedy Center, and New York's Carnegie Hall.

While traditionally drawing or repertoire from the sacred, folk, and collegiate choral traditions of Europe and North America, the Glee Club also commissions contemporary composers representing a broad array of experiences and styles. Recent commissions include contemporary settings of three African American spirituals by composer Brandon Waddles, and other pieces by Bongani Magatyana, Molly Joyce, Karen Thomas, Morten Lauridsen, Robert Kyr, and Sir John Taverner.

Commemoration of the Solemnity of Saint Agnes, Virgin, Martyr Monday, January 20 - Tuesday, January 21, 2025

Saint Agnes, Virgin and Martyr, is the patroness of our cathedral and diocese. We will celebrate this great feast with two days of celebration, including Solemn Vespers and Solemn Mass .

An important martyr in the early Church, Saint Agnes is mentioned in the second listing of saints in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I). Born in 291 AD, she was raised in a Christian family. Saint Agnes was very beautiful and highly sought after for marriage. However, she made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love for our Lord was so great that whenever a man wished to marry her, she would say, "Jesus Christ is my only spouse!" During a persecution, she was ordered to sacrifice to the pagan gods or be violated. She was tortured, but preserving her virginity, she was martyred and finally saw her heavenly spouse.

Sunday evening, we will solemnly celebrate Second Vespers of Saint Agnes. The Solemn Vespers from the Liturgy of the Hours will consist of hymns, canticles, and chanting the psalms. Our Cathedral Choirs will be featured in the singing of the psalms and we will hear sacred polyphony and choral works. Vespers will conclude with a blessing with a relic of Saint Agnes and the opportunity for individual veneration.

On the Day of the Solemnity of our patroness, Saint Agnes, there will be a Solemn Mass at which The Cathedral Singers will enhance our prayer and festive spirit with selections from Tomás Luis de Victoria's Missa O Quam Gloriosum and other sacred works.

Boys' Choir Investiture Sunday, March 16, 2025, 10:45 AM

Our Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys and the Diocesan Boys and Teens Choir of Rockville Centre have a rich history here in Rockville Centre and beyond. Beginning its 64th year, the flourishing 75 voice Cathedral Choirs will invest the new Probationers (first year singers) into the Choir and sing for the 11:00 AM Mass. Veteran singers will also be recognized.



The Choir was begun at the request of the first Bishop of our Diocese, the late Most Reverend Walter P. Kellenberg. Early special performances include performing with Leonard Bernstein at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and at Shea Stadium for His Holiness, Pope St. John Paul II. Under the direction of Mr. Bower, the choir has continued to travel and perform in many places, including, the White House, Lincoln Center, the Vatican and with Gerald Wirth in Vienna, Austria.

Sung Solemn Vespers on Lenten Sunday Evenings March 9, 16, 23, 30*, April 6, 13, 4:30 PM

The season of Lent, by means of penance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, is meant to dispose the faithful, who more diligently hear the word of God and devote themselves to prayer, to celebrate the paschal mystery of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. On the Sunday evenings of Lent, we will pray Solemn Vespers from the Liturgy of the Hours. During this season when it is most appropriate to meditate upon the Word of God, we will enter into this scripturally based prayer of singing the psalms and reading from scripture. A homily will be preached at each celebration.

On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday, (March 10) a day marking that the Lenten season is more than halfway through, penitential discipline is lightened up. The evening's liturgy will feature our choir and a fuller usage of the organ, which is only played to sustain singing during Lent.

The Office of Tenebrae Wednesday, April 16, 7:30 PM

A new favorite at Saint Agnes, drawing from an ancient tradition, the hauntingly beautiful Office of Tenebrae commemorates the betrayal

death, and burial of Christ. In days of old, it comprised the Church's early morning prayers, though it would be anticipated on the night before. The image of light and darkness is prominent in this celebration, as fifteen candles will be extinguished gradually, symbolizing the abandonment of Jesus by his disciples.

The prayer will begin with the Office of Readings from the Church's current Liturgy of the Hours with the chanting of the psalms and reading from scripture. It will continue with other distinctive elements of the traditional Office of Tenebrae, readings from sacred scripture and early Church Fathers, as well as the singing of the Lamentations of Jeremiah, and the Allegri "Miserere," which was originally composed for the Office of Tenebrae. The congregation will be engaged in the prayers and singing, while at the same time, masterpieces will be brought out from the Church's treasury of sacred music to enhance our prayer.
