The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Principal's Announcements

Feast of the Holy Family

"He went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man."

It's always easier to see the big picture when we look backward. With the gift of hindsight, we can often see the reasons why we went through certain trials in our lives and the graces that we obtained through them. It's tempting to think that the Blessed Virgin was somehow different from the rest of us—that she always knew the whole plan of her life from beginning to end and never had to work her way through difficult periods.

Today's Gospel reading tells us that wasn't the case. When Jesus was lost in the Temple, Mary and Joseph didn't know where he was. They didn't know what was going on, or how it would all be resolved. It's safe to assume they prayed, but they weren't given an instant vision like some heavenly GPS sign that told them where to find Jesus. Instead, for three long days they searched, growing more anxious and fearful as the days passed.

Just like us, Mary had to rely on hope during those dark times because she didn't have all the answers. When we go through trials, we can draw encouragement from the example of Mary and Joseph. We pray and we persist in prayer, trusting that God always hears us and will respond in his time, not ours, and always believing that when we seek Jesus, we will find him in his Father's house.

Happy New Year from Catholics for Freedom of Religion in Myrtle Beach, SC

- In 2014 the Board of Directors of Catholics for Freedom of Religion asked Carol Jean Walters to become the South Carolina State Director of Catholics for Freedom of Religion. Carol Jean, a member of St. Andrew parish in Myrtle Beach, said yes to the challenge of initiating freedom of religion education and events in SC. - In addition to providing our bulletin insert articles to SC parishes, Carol Jean has hosted 9 years of celebrations of National Religious Freedom Day on each Jan. 16. That day is a dinner and ceremony where students from St. Andrews school receive awards for the winning essays on Religious Freedom, several veterans who attend with family and friends are awarded "Quilts of Valor "and the Fr. Anthony Montesinos Council #5086 Knights of Columbus present the ceremonial, traditional folding of the American flag.

-For eleven years Carol Jean has also reached out to the governor requesting a State of South Carolina Declaration of Religious Freedom. Those Declarations have been issued and South Carolina joins only a few states making that effort to alert and educate their citizens.

-For the 112th consecutive month Carol Jean and Catholics from St. Andrew, St. Michael, Our Lady Star of the Sea and other visitors from as far away as Canada and Cuba, prayed the Rosary for America on Dec. 15 asking Mary to intercede for our nation's citizens and leaders that we may preserve the inalienable rights from our Creator, including Freedom of Religion. The public prayer was suggested by Bishop Emeritus Robert E. Guglielmone who urged prayer in public in addition to prayers in our churches. The monthly rosary is prayed at Myrtle Beach's Warbird Park, dedicated to the men and women of the United States Air Force.

Diocese of Rockville Centre Eucharistic Pilgrimage

During those days, Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to the town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. Luke 1: 39-40

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. The Western Route will journey from St. Agnes Cathedral (Rockville Centre) through Nassau County, while the Eastern Route will journey from the Parish of Saint Therese of Lisieux (Montauk) through Suffolk County.


The Holy Eucharist will be carried in procession across the Diocese through many of our towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. During this pilgrimage, there will be opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, public processions, and other Eucharistic celebrations. The People of God will be invited to walk with Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, pray in the pilgrim churches, and proclaim the Gospel to bystanders as Jesus passes through their towns.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre is inviting a dedicated group of young adults, ages 18 to 29, to apply to be *Perpetual Pilgrims*. These Perpetual Pilgrims will make the entire nine-day journey with the Lord in the Eucharist across the Diocese from May 31st - June 7th 2025, along with priest chaplains and an official pilgrimage team.
