Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted) in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.



We will celebrate a Mass for special needs children, and their families on **Saturday, February 15th** at 5:00 p.m. in the Lower Hall of the Monsignor Melton Auditorium.

This area is handicapped accessible, allowing families with children, who have developmental disabilities, access to the Lower Hall to celebrate God's presence in their lives.



In today's Gospel, St. Luke is recounting the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. Jesus returns "in the power of the Holy Spirit" to Nazareth and stands up in the synagogue to read from a passage he selects from the prophet Isaiah. In it, Isaiah declares that the Spirit of the Lord has commissioned him to announce good news to the poor, news of release from captivity, recovery of sight for the blind, liberty to the oppressed—all in all, a year "of the Lord's favor," that is, the Old Testament celebration of what was called the Year of Jubilee. Jesus applies that passage to himself. At the start of his own ministry, he also announces a new beginning for Israel. He is the one who will release prisoners from captivity to sin, open the eyes of faith, deliver those under demonic oppression, and complete the restorations that the Jubilee Year stands for.

But it isn't just the people of Jesus' time who experience the newness. The Holy Spirit continues that work in the Body of Christ, the Church, as Paul describes in the second reading. The Spirit's gifts are freely bestowed on the members of the Church and are exercised in a spirit of unity, so that "there may be no discord in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another." These are ministry gifts, whose function is to continue in the body the same liberating work of Jesus. Even after twenty centuries, the "year" of Jubilee is only beginning.



Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. The Western Route will journey from St. Agnes Cathedral (Rockville Centre) through Nassau County, while the Eastern Route will journey from the Parish of Saint Therese of Lisieux (Montauk) through Suffolk County.

The Holy Eucharist will be carried in procession across the Diocese through many of our towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries, and parishes. During this pilgrimage, there will be opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, public processions, and other Eucharistic celebrations. The People of God will be invited to walk with Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, pray in the pilgrim churches, and proclaim the Gospel to bystanders as Jesus passes through their towns.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre is inviting a dedicated group of young adults, ages 18 to 29, to apply to be *Perpetual Pilgrims*. These Perpetual Pilgrims will make the entire nine-day journey with the Lord in the Eucharist across the Diocese from May 31st - June 7th 2025, along with priest chaplains and an official pilgrimage team.

These pilgrims will represent the many young people from across Long Island who are on fire with Eucharistic love and missionary fervor. Applicants should be in good physical condition, capable of walking long distances, and committed to Christ, the teachings of his Church, and ongoing intellectual and spiritual formation.

The Importance of Being Obviously Catholic Passing on our faith through valued traditions

A bishop explained at a Religious Freedom service that as a young boy in communist Poland he had to hide his intention to enter the priesthood. His family, friends, parish priest and even his parents could not be told. He kept his vocation a secret because if his school administrators or the local government officials found out, the young man knew the harsh political and social reality of communist Poland would result in his being refused an education and prevented from entering the priesthood.

That young man, and millions of other men and women around the world, were and still are denied what most Americans take for granted... the First Amendment religious freedom to choose our faith and our worship and live it openly and freely without fear of perscution.


America's freedom of religion is not perfectly protected, but is strong enough that most Americans can live their faith satisfactorily to their conscience demands. However, when Supreme Court Justice Samuel Alito was recently asked if he thought our religious freedom laws would continue to protect Americans his answer was that he believes the religious freedom laws will prevail, but the culture of faith may not.

Thanks to the protection of America's religious freedom and rights of conscience we can create a culture of faith in our homes and our family lives...a culture reflecting that we are obviously and deliberately Catholic. Because we are protected in living out this culture, we can pass on the faith traditions which become the fertile soil where our children can develop their own, mature assent to the Catholic faith.

The traditions of each liturgical season as well as daily Catholic traditions will define such a family culture. Observing with the family the disciplines of Lent and the observances of Holy Week and the Easter vigil; honoring Mother Mary during the month of May with an outside flower garden or an inside May altar; participating in a Corpus Christi procession with the church congregation and observing Advent as the preparation for the Birth of the Christ child which will be the cause and focus of our Christmas celebration are rich liturgical traditions.

In addition to the seasonal traditions "there are traditions embedded in the structure of Catholic family life, traditions that become the pulse of the household. There is the evening Rosary. The bowing at the name of Christ. The signs of the cross when passing a Catholic parish. The prayers before meals and bed time. The little family prayer table with candles, crucifix, and images of Our Lady and St. Francis. The visits to the Blessed Sacrament. The lighting of holy candles for prayer intentions. And all the other numerous little customs that make our lives uniquely *Catholic*." Traditions help our children experience "the importance, the priority and the habit of living as faith-filled children of God."


