You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Blessed are the...

In this week's Gospel, Jesus presents us with a roadmap for blessedness. In the Beatitudes, Christ tells his followers that true happiness and fulfillment come from humility and service that reflect his own life.

Jesus identifies himself with the things that the world detests most—poverty, suffering, hunger, and opposition. He himself experiences these humiliations and sufferings described in today's Gospel reading, and he invites us to follow him. Jesus is reminding his disciples that it is the humble way of the Lord that will bring true happiness in life. Jesus contrasts this true happiness with the perceptions of his own day—that happiness comes from being rich, eating well, and being popular.

These perceptions still exist today, and Jesus doesn't condemn the wealthy or powerful in this world. Rather, he questions those whose hearts are concerned more about their worldly fortune and influence than they are concerned about the graces offered by the kingdom of God.

Registration for **new** students to the school for the 2025-26 school year is currently in effect. If you have a child who will be entering kindergarten in the fall of 2025, or an older child in grades 1-7 wishing to transfer to St. Agnes, please call the school office to set up a time to come in to register. Please note that the following documents are needed for registration:

- **Birth Certificate**
- **Baptismal Certificate (if applicable)**
- **Current Report Card and Standardized Testing for students in grades 1-7**

- Parish Envelope Number (if applicable)

Students entering kindergarten must be 5 years old by December 1, 2025. The following non-refundable fees are due at registration:

- Kindergarten: \$300
- Grades 1-7: \$150

Acceptance is based on the successful completion of Kindergarten and 1st-grade screenings. For students in Grades 2-8, acceptance will be determined following a review of transcripts and an interview with the principal.

Efforts for the Protection of Religious Liberty for All

During the first month of 2025 the protection and flourishing of religious liberty in the United States has been the object of the annual report from the United States Bishops and of actions of the new federal administration.

On Jan. 16, 2025 *The State of Religious Liberty in the United States*, the annual report from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) was released. The USCCB committee's report here <https://tinyurl.com/5eyp8hyh> describes the five areas of critical concern—some as threats and some as opportunities—for religious liberty:

- the targeting of faith-based immigration services
- the persistence of elevated levels of antisemitic incidents
- IVF mandates, which represent a significant threat to religious freedom, while the national discussion of IVF represents an opportunity for Catholics to share Church teaching and advocate for human dignity

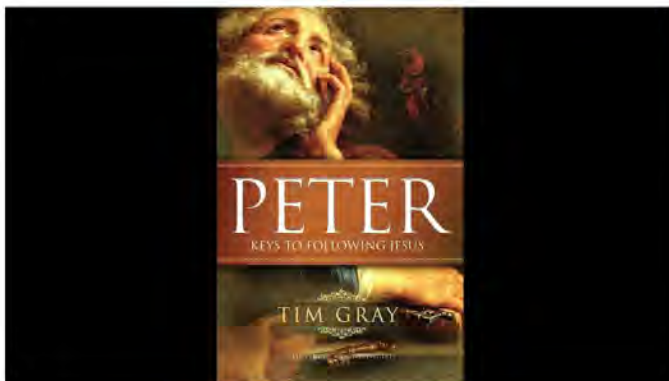
- the scaling back of gender ideology in law parental choice in education, one of the longest-running areas of concern

Significant actions by the federal government during January, 2025 have the goal of protecting conscience rights for all. The administration has reinstated two policies: the Mexico Policy preventing tax dollars from funding international organizations which promote sterilization and abortion and the Hyde Amendment which mandates that no tax dollars finance elective abortions in this country. An executive order also recognized that there are two sexes, male and female, and that life begins at conception. At the National Prayer breakfast, the president announced a new task-force to root out anti-Christian bias and the formation of a Commission on Religious Liberty as well as the establishment of a faith office in the White House.

Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress.
