





Devotions



Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

*"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace,
according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation,
which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples:
a light for revelation to the Gentiles,
and glory for your people Israel."*

On this 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, which also coincides with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we are invited to reflect on the profound moment when Jesus is brought into the Temple. This event marks His public entrance into the world, as He offers Himself as the "Light of the Nations" to all people. It reminds us to present our lives to God, seeking His enlightenment and guidance through prayer and a commitment to living according to His teachings.

From today's Gospel, we learn the following lessons:

- The elderly Simeon, filled with the Holy Spirit, recognizes Jesus as the Messiah. This moment signifies that Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promises and a beacon of hope for all of humanity.
- Just as Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple, we are called to present our own lives and intentions to God, offering our joys, struggles, and desires through prayer and service.
- Jesus is described as the "Light of the World," illuminating the darkness of our lives and guiding us toward a life of faith and love.

This week the school children will have their throats blessed in honor of the Feast of St. Blaise on February 3rd.

St. Agnes Cathedral School Registration Now Open

Registration for **new** students to the school for the 2025-26 school year is currently in effect. To register, the following documents are needed:

- Birth Certificate
- Baptismal Certificate (if applicable)
- Current Report Card and Standardized Testing for students in grades 1-7
- Parish Envelope Number (if applicable)

Students entering kindergarten must be 5 years old by December 1, 2025. The following non-refundable fees are due at registration:

- Kindergarten: \$300
- Grades 1-7: \$150

Acceptance is based on the successful completion of Kindergarten and 1st grade screenings. For students in Grades 2-8, acceptance will be determined following a review of transcripts and an interview with the principal.

Tuition assistance is available through the Tomorrow's Hope Foundation. The 2025-26 scholarship application opened on January 16th and is due by April 30th. For more information, please visit: [Tomorrow's Hope Foundation](#).

Transportation Reminder: If your child resides in a district outside of Rockville Centre, please remember that you must register for transportation for the 2025-26 school year. Notification to your district is required by April 1st- no exceptions. Contact your district's transportation department to request the necessary application.

Religious Liberty Protects Life


The completion of another well-attended and enthusiastic March for Life in Washington, D.C. sustains our hope for a future where all life is cherished and protected. The approach to protecting life on a state by state basis, in keeping with our Constitution, calls for different strategies but does not change the ultimate goal nor diminish our determination.

Religious Liberty, the right of each American to choose his faith and to exercise that faith freely, is the most critical support for the ability to make the choice for life. Denial of the freedom of conscience that is religious liberty means that citizens, as we too often see, are forced to provide products and services abhorrent to their religious beliefs... taxes can be used to fund abortions, transgender surgeries, abortion inducing drugs, euthanasia, etc.

When the Board of Directors of Catholics for Freedom of Religion (CFFR) attended a conference in Washington D.C. several years ago, we met the President of the March for Life, Jeanne Mancini. When we explained our volunteers' work to teach and strengthen religious freedom, Jeanne responded that pro-life advocates should better understand the role of religious freedom in preserving life.

She urged us to attend the next March for Life and reserved an exhibit table for CFFR where we could offer materials and educate attendees at the march. That began busy years of planning and then a whirlwind trip to D.C. to set up our exhibit, display the hand knit hats we offered free of charge to marchers and distribute the souvenir buttons. Five thousand buttons were added to students' hats each year as they marched for Life! We shared the buttons, explained the importance of religious liberty to choosing life and provided materials to read and share.





Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. 




