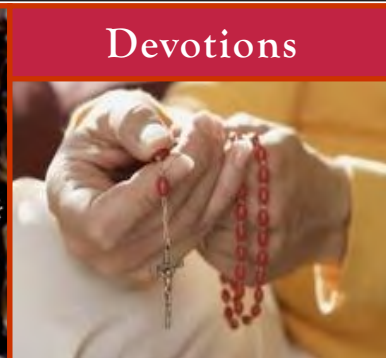

Dear Saint Agnes Cathedral Parishioners,

About three years ago, Bishop Barres invited me into a new chapter of priestly ministry as his Delegate for Catholic Schools and Director of Evangelization and Catechesis, with residence here at Saint Agnes. While it was difficult to leave St. Dominic's in Oyster Bay, coming to a place tied to my childhood—where I often visited my grandparents and prayed with my grandmother in this very Cathedral—felt like coming home.

This past week, Bishop Barres informed me that, as of June 25, 2025, I will be moving to St. Joseph Parish in Garden City, while continuing my diocesan work.

Though my role here was as a resident priest, these past three years have deeply shaped my priesthood. The Masses, our young men's group, the school community, and the many sacraments I've been privileged to celebrate with you—each moment has been a gift, and I leave with a heart full of gratitude.

I am so grateful to Bishop Barres for the opportunity to live and serve here these last years. I am also very grateful to our Rector, Fr. Duffy, and to the priests and the staff of the Cathedral who have made Saint Agnes a very comfortable home for me. I am indebted to them for their inspiring priestly witness and fraternal charity.

Fr. Duffy has graciously invited me to celebrate a farewell Mass on Sunday, June 22 at 9:30am. I hope to see you there and thank you personally for everything you have done and have been for me these past three years.

Though my residence will change, Garden City is not far—I remain here for you in any way I can. Please keep me in your prayers as I prepare for this transition.

5th Sunday of Easter



The theme from today's readings focuses on enduring hardships and trials embracing the crosses that God allows into our lives. In our human nature, we find ourselves resistant to this kind of suffering. We avoid it and anxiously try to change situations that are unpleasant.

But God is inviting us to trust him in our day-to-day lives, even when our circumstances are unpleasant or involve difficulty. God is inviting us to share in his passion. This theme comes through clearly in the Gospel reading when Jesus says, "Now is the Son of Man glorified," just as Judas is leaving to betray him. It is precisely through the suffering Christ will face in his betrayal, passion, and death that he is glorified. This is at the heart of our Catholic faith. One of the great mysteries of our faith is that we are all called to share in Christ's glory, by sharing in his suffering.

Just as Jesus offers up the poverty of his battered condition on the cross, and God uses it to transform the world, so too we are called to offer up the sufferings and poverty of our lives. When we are willing to embrace the poverties of our day-to-day lives and offer those up in trustful surrender and in union with Christ's sacrifice to the Father, God will transform them into amazing riches.
