Eucharistic Adoration is the traditional Catholic practice of taking the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, and placing it in a sun-shaped vessel called a Monstrance in order for the faithful to look upon Our Lord and pray to Him in peaceful contemplation. You are invited to join us **every Wednesday (unless otherwise noted)** in the Cathedral from 2:00–5:00 p.m. for Adoration and some quiet reflection and prayer.

The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Mass each Monday through Friday in the Cathedral except on Saturdays when it is prayed after the 7:45 a.m. Mass.

Principal's Announcements

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Today's Gospel passage is one of the more confusing ones for many people. It tells the story of a dishonest steward who writes off part of his master's debts, in essence cheating his master of some of the money that was due him. And yet Jesus commends this dishonest man. What are we to make of this?

First of all, this is not a morality parable. Jesus is not telling us that we should become dishonest. Instead, the purpose is to show us that we must think ahead; we must plan for our eternal future, not just for our lives in the here and now.

In the story, the rich master stands for God, who has entrusted much to each of us in the way of talents, financial resources, abilities, and more. Like the master, one day he will ask if we have used wisely what we have been given freely. However, unlike the master in the parable, God wants us to give away generously what we have been given generously. He wants us to give away his gifts to free others literally and figuratively. So, in commending the steward, Jesus is telling us that if we

are like him, we will be generous with all we have been given. Then, when we stand at the gates of heaven, there will be many friends who will speak up for us, just as those whose debts were forgiven spoke up for the steward.

Lying at the heart of this parable are two important questions: How am I stewarding the resources God has given me? What am I doing now with what God has entrusted to me? Our response is vital, for, as Jesus is telling us so clearly, one day we will all be called to render an account.

This week the students will begin the iReady Diagnostic 1 Assessment. The students should come to school well-rested, eat a nutritious breakfast, have their iPads fully charged and earphones/earbuds with them every day.

The week will end with the Mothers' Club Going Gold event fundraiser for pediatric cancer. The students may wear their gym uniforms to school with a yellow or gold t-shirt.

Making It a Personal Goal to Learn More About the Constitution that Declares our Liberty and Shapes Our Lives

Just as the Catechism’s teachings are foundational and irreplaceable to living the life of a faithful Catholic, the Constitution of the United States is the guide and the guard of the liberties it sets forth as the rights given to each of us from our Creator, including religious freedom.

To excuse ourselves from the responsibility to learn all we are able about this essential founding document is to disregard the danger, toil and immense sacrifices of those who won our freedom and to risk the loss of liberty. Not willing to lose this hard won freedom, the founders established a system of shared power with checks and balances. That systematic governance was and is reliant on the morality and knowledge of those who are governed by it.

If we choose to remain ignorant of the most basic knowledge of our Constitution, how can we possibly discern the truthfulness, intentions and intelligence of those we have chosen to protect our freedoms? Religious freedom is threatened daily. Thomas Jefferson wrote, “The natural progress of things is for liberty to yield, and

government to gain ground.” He and other founders often counseled that the only sure repository for freedom is with the people, not the government.

Our founders had few books and no electronic media and yet endeavored to learn their Constitution, discuss its provisions and pass it to their children and grandchildren. And yet, in 1828 Arthur Stansbury wrote the most popular school text ever which was the Catechism of the Constitution. Rev Stansbury was concerned that knowledge of the Constitution was waning and he feared the loss of essential freedoms due to ignorance of our rights.

Debates and discussions of our freedoms and responsibilities are ineffective unless we have knowledge of the Constitution. We assume that some vague, amorphous, non-specific force called “The Constitution” will guard our equality and protect all that is critical to our lives as well as our families and our future generations. In fact, there is no protection if we choose ignorance.

“ ... Cities may be rebuilt, and a People reduced to Poverty, may acquire fresh Property: But a Constitution of Government once changed from Freedom, can never be restored. Liberty once lost is lost forever. 


