


Seeing God in the Poor



## Principal's Announcements

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus tells a parable about a rich man who feasted every single day and Lazarus, a beggar, who lies outside the gate of the rich man's house. In the story, both men die and end up in very different places. The poor man ends up in the bosom of Abraham, and the rich man ends up in Hades. Now in Hades, the rich man wants the poor man to serve him, but Abraham says that isn't possible. Nor is it possible for Lazarus to go back to earth and warn the rich man's relatives. No, once we die, we are held accountable for what we did... and what we didn't do.

In this parable, it's what the rich man didn't do that has created his misery. The failure to do the good we should have done is called the sin of omission, and that's where the guilt of the rich man rests. He never saw Lazarus as another human being so he did nothing to alleviate his suffering. He might not have actually added to Lazarus' pain, but he failed to help him.

We all have people who are lying at the gate of our lives. Instead of stepping over them like the rich man did to Lazarus, we are called to use our resources, whatever they may be, to serve the poor in our lives lest we, too, be guilty of the sin of omission.

In addition, the second reading this week, although it does not directly talk about material wealth, does instruct us in how to be rich in character and how to live in imitation of Christ. Both readings remind us that regardless of our own personal financial situation, we can all increase our faith in abundance by serving the poor we encounter in our daily lives.

As the month of September comes to a close, we're beginning to feel the crispness of fall in the air. The students have settled nicely into their routines, the classrooms are buzzing with energy, and new friendships are blossoming like leaves turning with the season.

This week, students will continue working on their i-Ready diagnostic assessments. To help them do their best, please ensure your child:

- Gets a good night's sleep
- Has a healthy, nutritious breakfast
- Brings their fully charged iPad
- Brings their earbuds or headphones

## Focus on Religious Freedom

### The Five Freedoms of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

*-Text of the First Amendment*

The Constitution of the United States was fortified by the addition of the first ten amendments known as the Bill of Rights. It was added to further protect individual rights and to guard against government overreach.

America's founders were adamant that morality and religion, disbursed throughout the citizenry, would be the only sure protection of the natural liberties from their creator. It is not surprising then that religious freedom was the first of the rights emphasized. Freedom of speech was seen as the protection from tyrannical control over criticisms of government and, along with freedom of the press, was intended to prevent deceptions by government. Freedom of assembly and of redress gave citizens a practical approach to addressing laws and actions they believed denied their liberties.

The recent assassination of Charlie Kirk, a leading conservative Christian voice in this nation assaulted the freedom of religion and freedom of speech of every American. If these most basic freedoms are denied to one American, they may be denied to all.


Our founders knew that "Whoever would overthrow the liberty of a nation must begin by subduing the freeness of speech." - Benjamin Franklin.




