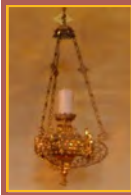

 Louisiana Law mandates Public Schools to Display the
 Ten Commandments

In 2024 Louisiana became the first state to mandate a display of the Ten Commandments and other historical founding documents in every K-12 classroom in public schools. The legislature and governor expected that law to be challenged in the courts. Two courts heard challenges to the law with the higher court allowing the law to go forward. The law could still be challenged at the Supreme Court, however, Louisiana governor, Jeff Landry, has instructed schools to go forward with the displays as directed by law.

The programmed reaction from too many Americans, that the Ten Commandments display “violates separation of church and state and does not belong in public schools” results from decades of deliberate media misinformation and the lack of accurate teaching in many schools. Separation of church and state is not in the Constitution

and is not a law. It was a phrase authored by Pres. Thomas Jefferson in a letter written to assure the Baptists community of Danbury, CT that ...”Religion is a matter which lies solely between man and his God. That he owes account to none other for his faith or his worship.” Jefferson emphasized separation of church and state protects individual conscience and churches from intrusion by the state.

Had we been taught more of America’s founding, every American would have learned the founders’ clear beliefs that the Ten Commandments and the Bible in school were necessary to the survival of this nation founded on the Creator’s gifts to each man.

*“The Ten Commandments and the Sermon on the Mount contain my religion,”
 wrote John Adams to Thomas Jefferson, Nov. 4, 1816.
 James Madison, the fourth President of the United States of America, stated that “(w)e have staked the whole future of our new nation . . . upon the capacity of each of ourselves to govern ourselves according to the moral principles of the Ten Commandments”.*

Principal's Announcements

Palm Sunday



Today, we enter the holy city of Jerusalem alongside Jesus, but our celebration is naturally quieted because we know the bittersweet reality of what is to come. As we join in the shouts of praise, we are aware that these same voices will soon turn into accusations and calls for His death. For us, this liturgy is a powerful reminder that our faith is not just about a temporary parade, but about the final victory of the Messiah that only comes after the struggle.

This experience teaches us that our entire spiritual life is a blend of grief and glory. We see this most clearly in the Mass, where we begin by humbly admitting our sins and end with the celebration of Communion. Every time we participate in the Eucharist, we are stepping into the whole mystery of Christ, bringing together the intimacy of the Last Supper and the profound sacrifice of Calvary.

Ultimately, when we receive Holy Communion, we receive the Risen Lord of Glory, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Palm Sunday shows us that we cannot separate the sacrifice from the victory. By embracing both, we come to a deeper understanding of the Eucharist as the complete and beautiful story of Christ's love for us.

As we approach the most sacred time of our liturgical year, we remain focused on the students' spiritual preparation as well as their academic responsibilities. Please note the following schedule and events for the coming week:

- ◆ **Monday, March 30th:** The Drama Club rehearsal.
- ◆ **Tuesday, March 31st:** Deadline for 2026-27 Transportation Requests. Please ensure these are submitted to your home school district by today.

- ◆ **Wednesday, April 1st:** Early Dismissal at 12:00 noon. We begin our transition into Holy Week, preparing our hearts for the solemn days ahead.

Our students have beautifully lived out their Lenten promises this season. Our hallways are currently overflowing with donations for the **Ronald McDonald House in New Hyde Park**. These gifts hold a special significance for our community, as this house provided food, shelter, and a place of peace for Mrs. Hofmann and her husband during their son's two-month hospital stay.

On April 1st, Mrs. Hofmann will join us as we deliver these donations. We are so proud of our students for showing such great compassion for families undergoing the hardship of a child's prolonged hospital stay. In addition to their acts of service, the students have spent time in quiet reflection using the **Hallow App** and have received the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**.

They have grown tremendously in their faith and are well-prepared to enter into the mystery of the Passion. As Lent concludes, we enter the **Easter Triduum**, the three-day period from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though it spans three calendar days, the Church views it as one single, unfolding celebration of Christ's Paschal Mystery. We invite our families to participate in these beautiful liturgical services as indicated in the bulletin and the Cathedral website.

May this Holy Week be a time of profound grace for you and your families. As we walk the path from the palms of Jerusalem to the glory of the Resurrection, may we always remember that Christ's victory is our own. Let us enter these sacred days with grateful hearts, united in the love and sacrifice of our Lord.

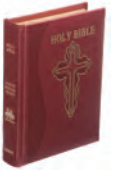

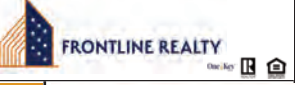
