Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Happy Easter to you and your families!

This Easter Sunday, Easter Octave, Divine Mercy Sunday and Easter Season we continue to pray and contemplate our Lord's Resurrection appearances, and we give thanks for Pope Leo XIV and his worldwide spirit of Catholic mission.

In his Cycle of Catechesis on the Resurrection of Christ, Pope Leo writes: "The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is an event that one never finishes contemplating and meditating on, and the more one explores it, the more one is filled with wonder, drawn in as if by an overwhelming yet fascinating light. It was an explosion of life and joy that changed the meaning of reality itself, from negative to positive; yet it did not happen in a striking way, much less a violent one, but gently, hidden, one might say humbly." (October 22, 2025 Audience)

Pope Leo recognizes that there is much sadness in the world – "a feeling of precariousness, at times profound desperation." We think especially of the daily crosses and trials of those from war-torn and violence-ridden areas of the world.

The Holy Father then reflects on the despair of the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus. Their hearts burn and their joy is restored as the Risen Lord explains the Scriptures to them and they recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. In this way, the Paschal Mystery gives us hope and strength in every trial and circumstance.

Pope Leo concludes: "May the unexpected joy of the disciples of Emmaus be a gentle reminder to us when the going gets tough. It is the Risen One who radically changes our perspective, instilling the hope that fills the void of sadness. On the paths of the heart, the Risen One walks with us and for us. He bears witness to the defeat of death and affirms the victory of life, despite the darkness of Calvary... He alone makes the impossible possible!"

May the Light of the Risen Christ illumine our path to holiness on earth and our path to eternal life and happiness with God in Heaven.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

¡Feliz Pascua a ustedes y a sus familias!

En este Domingo de Pascua, durante la Octava de Pascua, el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia y todo el Tiempo Pascual, continuamos orando y contemplando las apariciones del Señor Resucitado, y damos gracias por el Papa León XIV y su espíritu universal de misión católica.

En su ciclo de catequesis sobre la Resurrección de Cristo, el Papa León escribe: “La Resurrección de Jesucristo es un acontecimiento que nunca se termina de contemplar y meditar; y cuanto más se profundiza en él, más se llena uno de asombro, como atraído por una luz abrumadora y a la vez fascinante. Fue una explosión de vida y de alegría que cambió el sentido mismo de la realidad, de negativo a positivo; sin embargo, no ocurrió de manera llamativa, y mucho menos violenta, sino suavemente, de modo oculto, podríamos decir humildemente.” (Audiencia del 22 de octubre de 2025)

El Papa León reconoce que hay mucha tristeza en el mundo: “una sensación de precariedad, a veces de profunda desesperación”. Pensamos especialmente en las cruces y pruebas cotidianas de quienes viven en regiones del mundo marcadas por la guerra y la violencia.

El Santo Padre reflexiona luego sobre la desesperanza de los dos discípulos en el camino de Emaús. Sus corazones arden y su alegría es restaurada cuando el Señor Resucitado les explica las Escrituras y lo reconocen al partir el pan. De este modo, el Misterio Pascual nos da esperanza y fortaleza en toda prueba y circunstancia.

El Papa León concluye: “Que la alegría inesperada de los discípulos de Emaús sea para nosotros un suave recordatorio cuando el camino se hace difícil. Es el Resucitado quien cambia radicalmente nuestra perspectiva, infundiendo la esperanza que llena el vacío de la tristeza. En los caminos del corazón, el Resucitado camina con nosotros y por nosotros. Él da testimonio de la derrota de la muerte y afirma la victoria de la vida, a pesar de la oscuridad del Calvario... ¡Solo Él hace posible lo imposible!”

Que la Luz de Cristo Resucitado ilumine nuestro camino de santidad en la tierra y nuestro camino hacia la vida eterna y la felicidad con Dios en el Cielo.

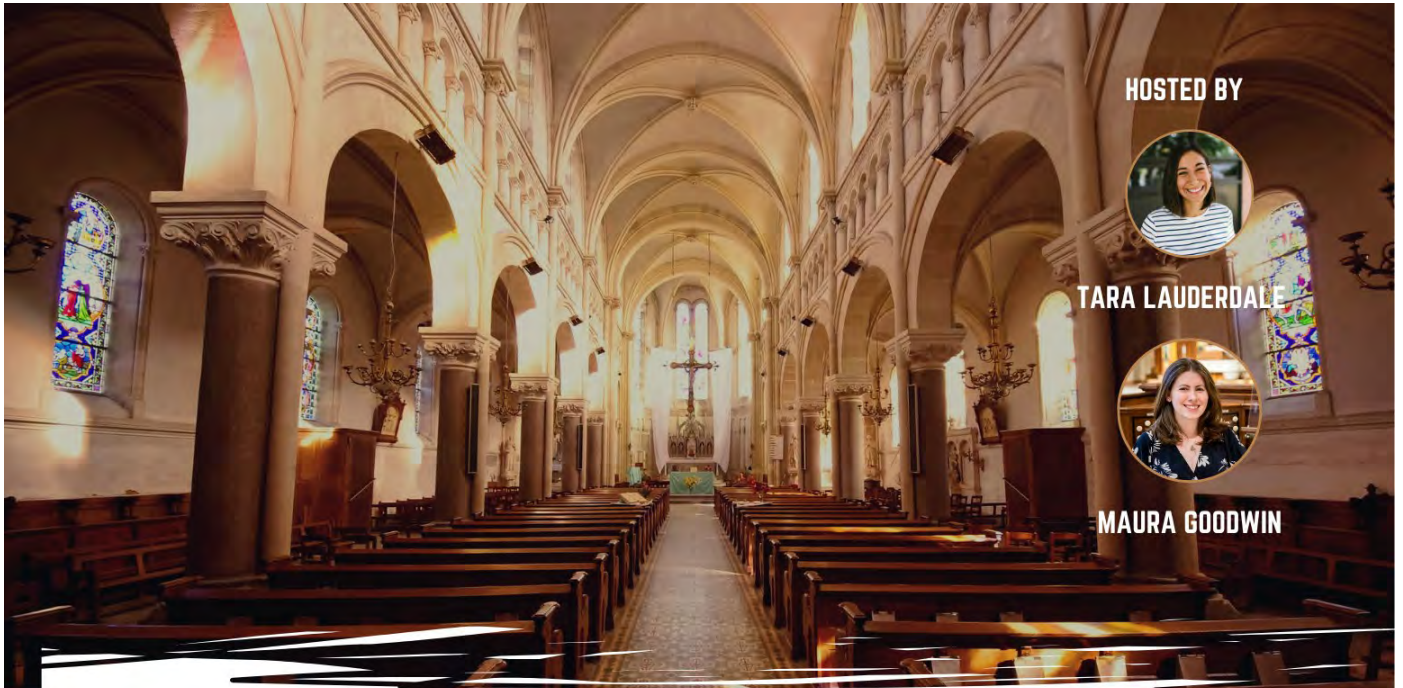

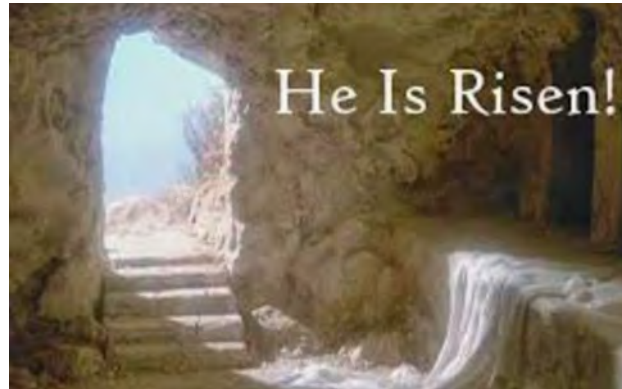

Easter Sunday



On the first Easter, it seems as if practically everyone, but the enemies of Jesus had forgotten His promise to rise on the third day. In the Gospel accounts, only those who opposed Jesus are reported as remembering that He predicted His death and resurrection. They assumed His followers would also remember and attempt to steal His body as "proof" of a miracle, so they asked the Romans to post a guard at the tomb.

They need not have bothered; the disciples had apparently forgotten or completely misunderstood what Jesus had told them over and over. Instead, the fearful Apostles were in hiding, and the women were arriving only to anoint a dead body.

However, just as the initial failure of those closest to Jesus to believe led to the eventual proclamation of His living presence throughout the world, we, too, can grow in faith and trust in His presence today. Though the mysteries of the Faith are not always readily understood, we should ask for the grace to believe and to grow in the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity. With these gifts, we receive the power to recognize the importance of the Resurrection and how it can transform our lives.

Alleluia, He is risen! He is risen indeed!

School is closed this week as we celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection of the Lord. May His peace be with you and your families during this Easter season.

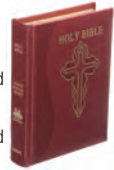
